#### 1. School of Architecture and Design

#### **Bachelor of Architecture**

The Bachelor of Architecture program has been granted initial accreditation as of 2019, by the National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB), which accredits architecture programs in the United States. The program is the first in Lebanon and the third outside the United States to receive NAAB accreditation: <a href="https://www.naab.org/">https://www.naab.org/</a>.

In addition to being recognized by the Ministry of Education in Lebanon, the Bachelor of Architecture is officially recognized by the Ministry of Culture in France.

#### **Bachelor of Design Programs**

The School of Architecture & Design at LAU earned the National Association of Schools of Art & Design (NASAD) Accreditation in 2020. The NASAD accreditation covers the BA in Fine Arts, the BFA in Interior Design, the BFA in Graphic Design and the BFA in Fashion Design and the Master in Islamic Art.

#### **Bachelor of Science in Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (CP)**

The BS in Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (CP) at the School of Arts and Sciences has been granted candidacy for accreditation by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND), the accrediting agency for the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics (AND) in the US. As the first step in a four-year accrediting process, the candidacy by ACEND grants current and future students the same rights of a fully accredited program.

Out of only seven international programs with ACEND accreditation, the CP in the Department of Natural Sciences is the second dietetics education program to offer students the opportunity to sit for the Commission on Dietetic Registration (CDR) examination to become Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN) upon program completion.

The Adnan Kassar School of Business (AKSOB) at the Lebanese American University (LAU) is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International. In addition, AKSOB's Hospitality and Tourism Program is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Programs in Hospitality Administration (ACPHA).

#### **Doctor of Medicine**

The MD program has received on September 1, 2021 a two-year provisional accreditation from the Turkish Association for Evaluation and Accreditation of Medical Education Programs (TEPDAD), a World Federation for Medical Education (WFME)-recognized accreditation agency. The provisional accreditation allows LAU MD students and graduates to apply for an Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) certification, and

is equivalent to a full accreditation in terms of opportunities provided. TEPDAD introduced the provisional status due to COVID-19-related restrictions and the absence of on-site visits required to determine full status.

#### 7. School of Pharmacy



Over the past five years, pharmacy graduates have maintained an average pass rate of 91 percent on the North American Pharmacy Licensing Exam (NAPLEX®) and 100 percent on the Lebanese National Competency Assessment Examination (Colloquium). Graduates are well-placed to pursue graduate studies, postgraduate residencies, or work in diverse fields such as community and hospital pharmacies, clinical settings, pharmaceutical sales, pharmaceutical industry, and academia.











#### 150% Graduation Rates - Cohort Fall 2014


