Degree programs: Academic offerings include 63 degree programs: 37 bachelor's degree programs, 20 master's degree programs, 2 professional degree programs, 1 graduate diploma and 2 post-bachelor's certificates.

Mission: Lebanese American University is committed to academic excellence, student centeredness, civic engagement, the advancement of scholarship, the education of the whole person, and the formation of leaders in a diverse world.

Charter: LAU is chartered by the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York. The University of the State of New York is the sole entity authorized by the State of New York to incorporate higher education institutions and authorize them to confer degrees.

Recognition: Degrees awarded by the Lebanese American University are officially registered with the Ministry of Higher Education in Lebanon and with the Board of Education in the State of New York.

Institutional Accreditation

LAU is accredited by the **New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE)**, formerly the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc. LAU was granted initial accreditation for a five-year period following a site visit in November 2009. In 2014, LAU underwent a comprehensive evaluation and was re-accredited for a ten-year period.

Program Accreditation

1. School of Architecture and Design

NAAB Accreditation:

The School of Architecture and Design (SArD) has been granted official accreditation for its Bachelor of Architecture effective January 2019 by the American National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB), the only agency recognized by registration boards in US jurisdictions to accredit professional degree programs in architecture. The NAAB accreditation entitles graduates of the B.Arch program, who have the legal right to work in the United States, to sit for the licensure exam in the US, provided they complete the required training. French Equivalence of the B. Arch. Program:

In addition to being accredited by the National Architectural Accrediting Board in the US, the Bachelor of Architecture Program at LAU is officially recognized by the French government as equivalent to the *Diplome d'Etat d'Architecte* (DEA), that allows its holder to register for training leading to "I'habilitation de l'architecte diplome d'Etat a l'exercice de la maitrise d'oeuvre en son nom propre".

NASAD Accreditation:

LAU became an accredited institutional member of the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD) as of August 18, 2020. NASAD accreditation covers the BA in Fine Arts, the BFA in Interior Design, the BFA in Graphic Design, the BFA in Fashion Design and the MA in Islamic Art programs. 2. School of Arts and Sciences

Bachelor of Science in Computer Science

LAU's B.S. in Computer Science program is accredited by the Computing Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET).

Bachelor of Science in Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (CP)

The BS in Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (CP) at the School of Arts and Sciences has been granted candidacy for accreditation by the accrediting agency for the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics in the US. As the first step in a four-year accrediting process, the candidacy by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) grants current and future students the same rights of a fully accredited program.

Out of only seven international programs with ACEND accreditation, the CP in the Department of Natural Sciences is the only dietetics education program with a concentration in Interprofessional Education (IPE). It is also the only one in Lebanon to have an IPE approach.

3. Adnan Kassar School of Business

The Adnan Kassar School of Business (AKSOB) at the Lebanese American University (LAU) is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International. In addition, AKSOB's Hospitality and Tourism Program is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Programs in Hospitality Administration (ACPHA).

AKSOB's portfolio includes three undergraduate degree programs: B.S. in Business Studies, B.S. in Economics, and B.S. in Business Emphasis Hospitality and Tourism Management; and six graduate degree programs: Masters in Business Administration (MBA), Executive Masters in Business Administration (EMBA), M.A. in Applied Economics, Masters in Laws (LLM), Masters of Science in Human Resources Management (MS HRM) and Online Global MBA.

The school prepares students for the challenges of real-world situations through its many resources, including the school's cutting-edge Clinical Simulation Center and its clinical and basic sciences research lab.

Furthermore, students can gain training and earn scholarships through the school's local and international affiliations in research and clinical medicine.

The school's main clinical training center is the LAU Medical Center-Rizk Hospital and the LAU Medical Center-St John's Hospital (planned for summer 2020). LAU's medical students also train with a number of health facilities through affiliation/agreement arrangements.

Demonstrating the school's excellence, the majority of nursing students are hired immediately upon graduation in top hospitals and NGOs across Lebanon, while others go on to pursue their graduate studies in high-ranking universities in Lebanon and abroad.

Graduates are well-placed to pursue graduate studies, postgraduate residencies, or work in diverse fields such as community and hospital pharmacies, clinical settings, pharmaceutical sales, pharmaceutical industry, and academia.

The GSR office assists faculty and students with grant development, data analysis, and the promotion of novel discoveries along with associated patents and copyrights.








