Those wishing to gain a thorough understanding of the university's academic programs, services, students, faculty, staff, facilities and finances need only open its pages to obtain the necessary data.



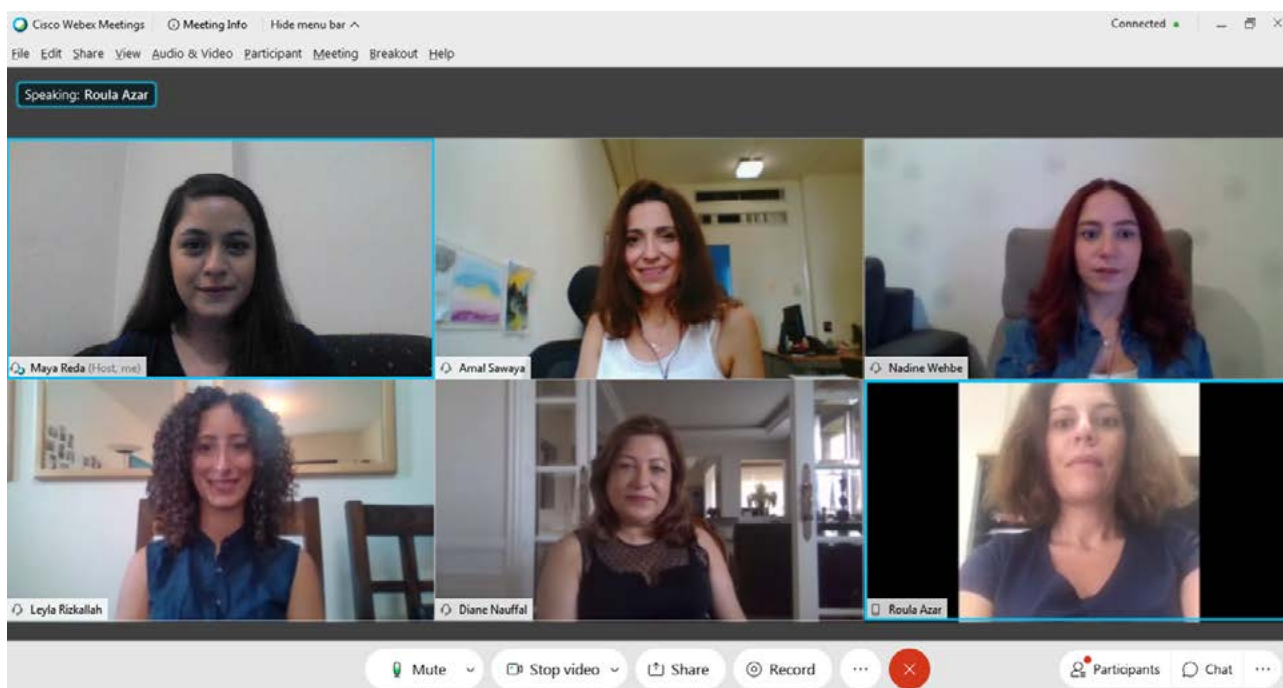

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ABOUT THE INSTITUTION

» History and Location

The Lebanese American University (LAU), a leading private higher education institution in Lebanon, operates under a charter from the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York. LAU is accredited by the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE).

LAU is a nonsectarian institution guided by a deeply rooted sense of shared ethical values. The university began as a women's college in 1924, with roots extending back to 1835, when the Ottoman Empire's first school for girls was founded. LAU expanded over the decades, catering to the growing educational needs of Lebanon, the Middle East and around the world. Today LAU boasts seven schools, along with 21 centers and institutes. Dynamic and distinguished faculty members research and teach in a wide range of academic disciplines.

LAU's two main campuses are located on leafy hillsides by the Mediterranean Sea, around 43 kilometers apart, putting LAU within easy reach of all areas of Lebanon. The Byblos and Beirut campuses offer similarly structured programs in the arts, sciences and business. Programs in nursing and medicine, as well as junior and senior-year courses in engineering and pharmacy, are offered exclusively in Byblos.

LAU still continues to expand today. With the establishment of its New York Headquarters and Academic Center and a new executive center in Beirut Central District, LAU continues its journey of perpetual improvement and progression.

» Accreditation

LAU is accredited by the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE), formerly the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc. In 2014 LAU underwent a comprehensive evaluation and was re-accredited for a ten-year period.

» Academic Schools and Colleges

The University comprises seven schools: The School of Architecture and Design, the School of Arts and Sciences, the Adnan Kassar School of Business, the School of Engineering, the Gilbert and Rose-Marie Chagoury School of Medicine, the Alice Ramez Chagoury School of Nursing and the School of Pharmacy.

► *Academic Programs and Degrees Conferred*

Academic offerings include 65 degree programs in 60 different major fields: 39 bachelor's degree programs, 21 master's degree programs, 2 professional degree programs, 1 graduate diploma and 2 post-bachelor's diplomas.

During the academic year 2019-2020, the university awarded 1,716 bachelor's degrees, 226 master's degrees, 81 doctoral-professional practice degrees and 48 post-bachelor's diplomas.

► *Faculty*

Full-time faculty for fall 2020 totaled 333, of whom 32 hold the rank of professor, 127 the rank of associate professor and 78 the rank of assistant professor. 80 percent of the full-time faculty hold a doctorate or other terminal degree.

► *Enrollment*

With 6,984 undergraduates, 793 graduates and 267 students in doctoral – professional practice degree programs, enrollments in fall 2020 totaled 8,044. Of the 7,297 full-time students, 92 percent are undergraduates, 4 percent are graduate students and 4 percent of the students are enrolled in doctoral – professional practice degree programs. The undergraduate student body is 48 percent male. Of the total number of students enrolled, 1,378 are from 75 foreign countries.

► *Admissions / Retention*

1,952 undergraduate students are enrolled for the fall 2020. 37 percent of all first-time applicants enrolled. 3,783 or 93 percent of accepted first-time students attended schools within Lebanon. 494 or 54 percent of graduate students were accepted and 66 percent enrolled in fall 2020. Of the students in doctoral – professional practice degree programs, 141 or 59 percent were accepted and 93 percent enrolled in the academic year 2020–2021.

► *Finance*

LAU's operating budget for 2019–2020 was \$203,012,524, a 2 percent increase from the 2018-2019 budget, reflecting the university's continued growth and expansion. 19 percent of this was earmarked for student financial aid.

► *Physical Facilities*

LAU campuses occupy 345,143 square meters of space, of which the Beirut campus represents 27,500 square meters and the Byblos campus 317,643 square meters. The university is also a major shareholder in the LAU Medical Center-Rizk Hospital.

CHARTER AND ACCREDITATION



CHARTER

LAU is chartered by the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York. The University of the State of New York is the sole entity authorized by the State of New York to incorporate higher education institutions and authorize them to confer degrees.

Beirut College for Women (which was to become LAU) was granted a provisional charter by the Board of Regents in 1950, and an absolute charter five years later. Since then, the charter has been amended several times in response to the institution's growth.

The University of the State of New York is a large system of educational services, including thousands of schools, colleges, universities, museums, libraries and other institutions. Its Board of Regents sets overall education policy for the State of New York and chooses a Commissioner of Education, who serves as president of the University of the State of New York and heads the New York State Education Department.

ACCREDITATION

Degrees awarded by the Lebanese American University are officially registered with the Ministry of Higher Education in Lebanon and with the Board of Education in the State of New York.

PROGRAM ACCREDITATION

1. School of Architecture and Design

Bachelor of Architecture

The Bachelor of Architecture program has been granted initial accreditation as of 2019, by the National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB), which accredits architecture programs in the United States. The program is the first in Lebanon and the third outside the United States to receive NAAB accreditation: <https://www.naab.org/>.

In addition to being recognized by the Ministry of Education in Lebanon, the Bachelor of Architecture is officially recognized by the French Government, which allows our graduates to practice in France and the European Union.

Bachelor of Design Programs

The School of Architecture & Design at LAU earned the NASAD Accreditation, which covers all its art and design programs. NASAD accreditation covers the BA in Fine Arts, the BFA in Interior Design, the BFA in Graphic Design and the BFA in Fashion Design. 2. School of Arts and Sciences

Bachelor of Science in Computer Science

LAU's B.S. in Computer Science program is accredited by the Computing Accreditation Commission of ABET, <https://www.abet.org>.

Bachelor of Science in Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (CP)

The BS in Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (CP) at the School of Arts and Sciences has been granted candidacy for accreditation by the accrediting agency for the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics in the US. As the first step in a four-year accrediting process, the candidacy by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) grants current and future students the same rights of a fully accredited program.

Out of only six international programs with ACEND accreditation, the CP in the Department of Natural Sciences is the only dietetics education program with a concentration in Interprofessional Education (IPE). It is also the only one in Lebanon to have an IPE approach.

3. Adnan Kassar School of Business

The Adnan Kassar School of Business (AKSOB) at the Lebanese American University (LAU) is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International. In addition, AKSOB's Hospitality and Tourism Program is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Programs in Hospitality Administration (ACPHA).

AKSOB's portfolio includes three undergraduate degree programs: B.S. in Business Studies, B.S. in Economics, and B.S. in Hospitality and Tourism Management; and five graduate degree programs: Masters in Business Administration (MBA), Executive Masters in Business Administration (EMBA), M.A. in Applied Economics, Masters in Laws (LLM), and Masters of Science in Human Resources Management (MS HRM).

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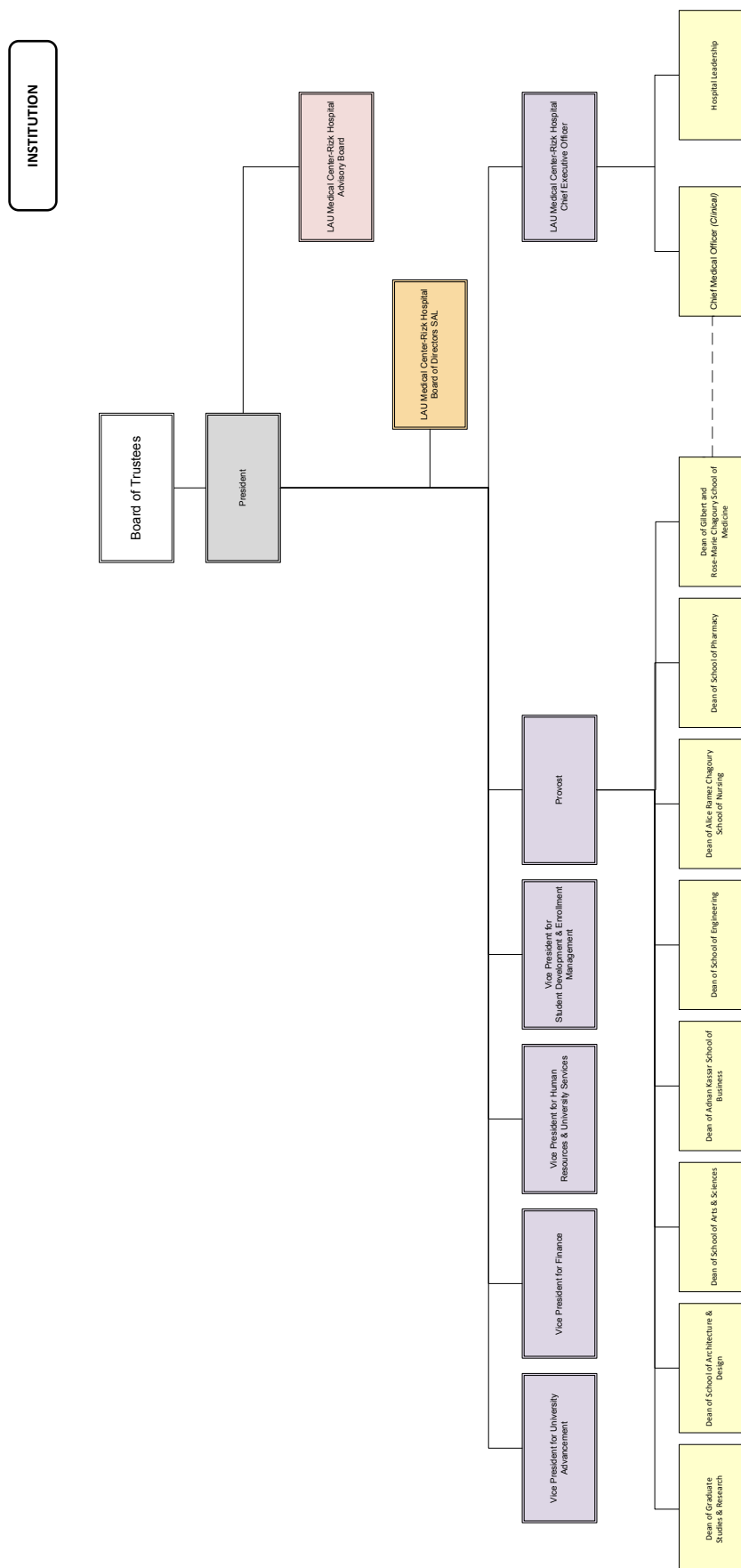

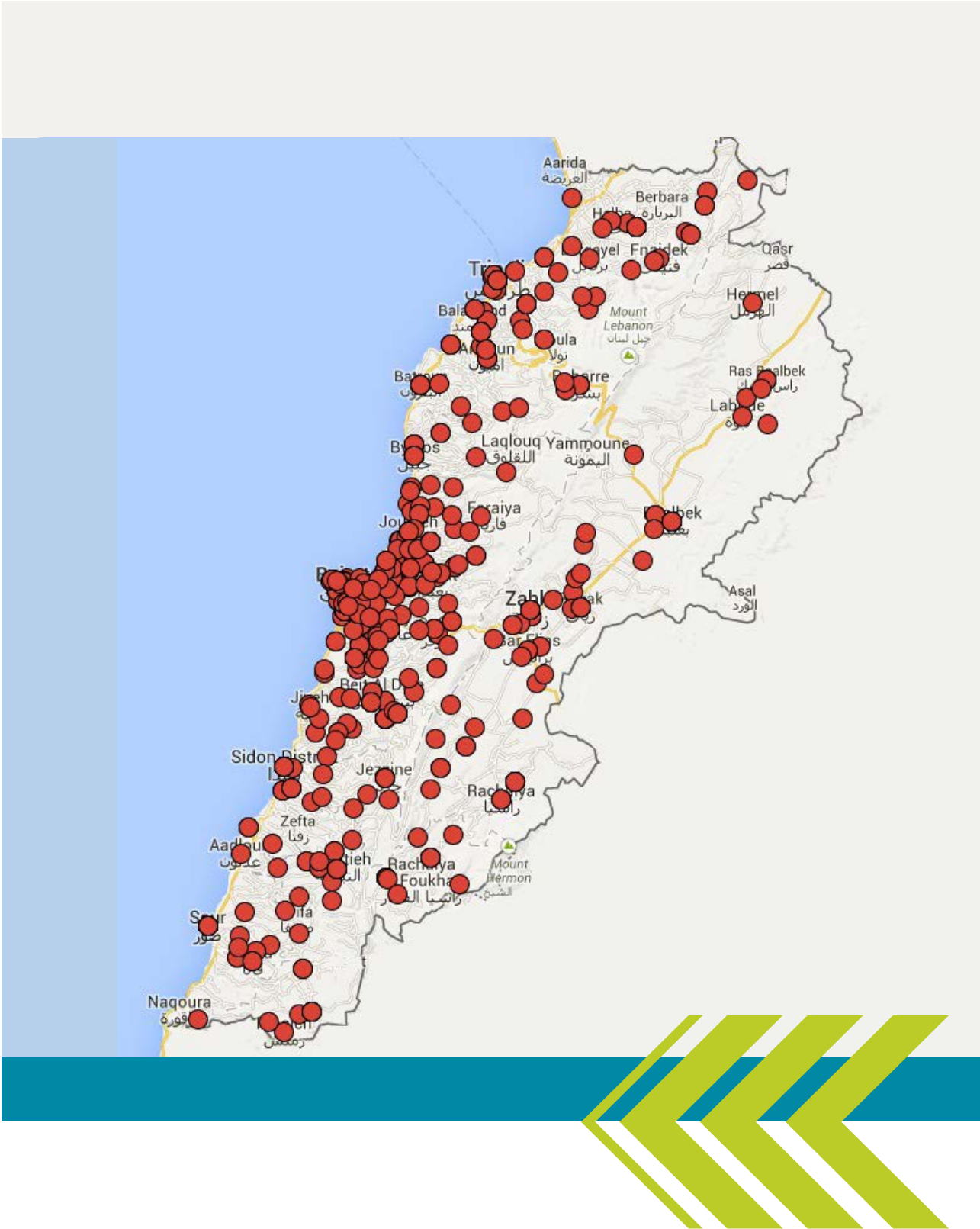

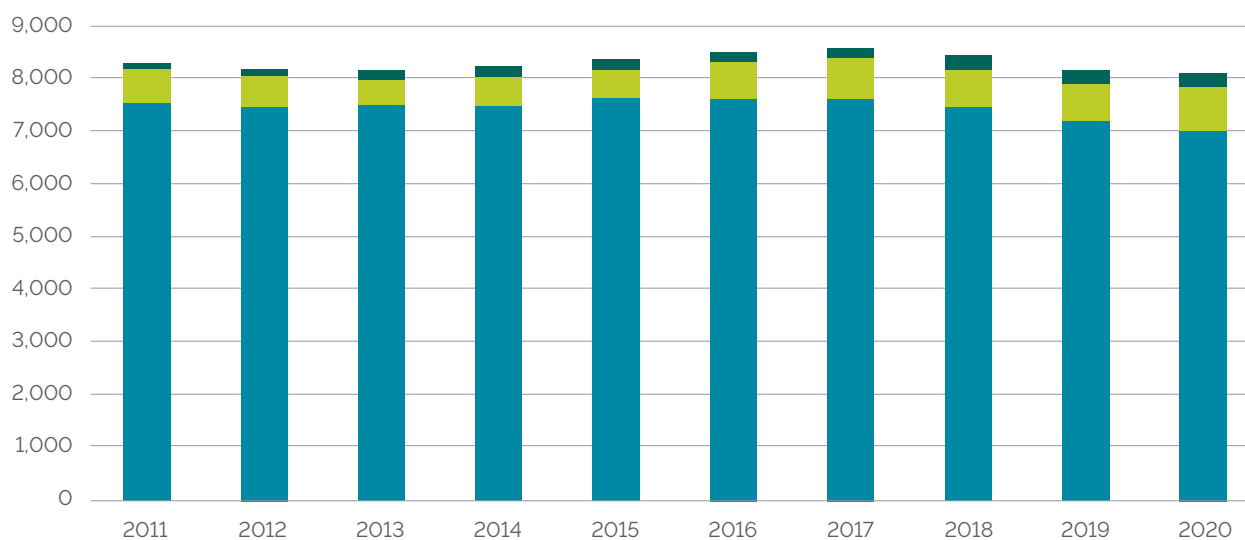

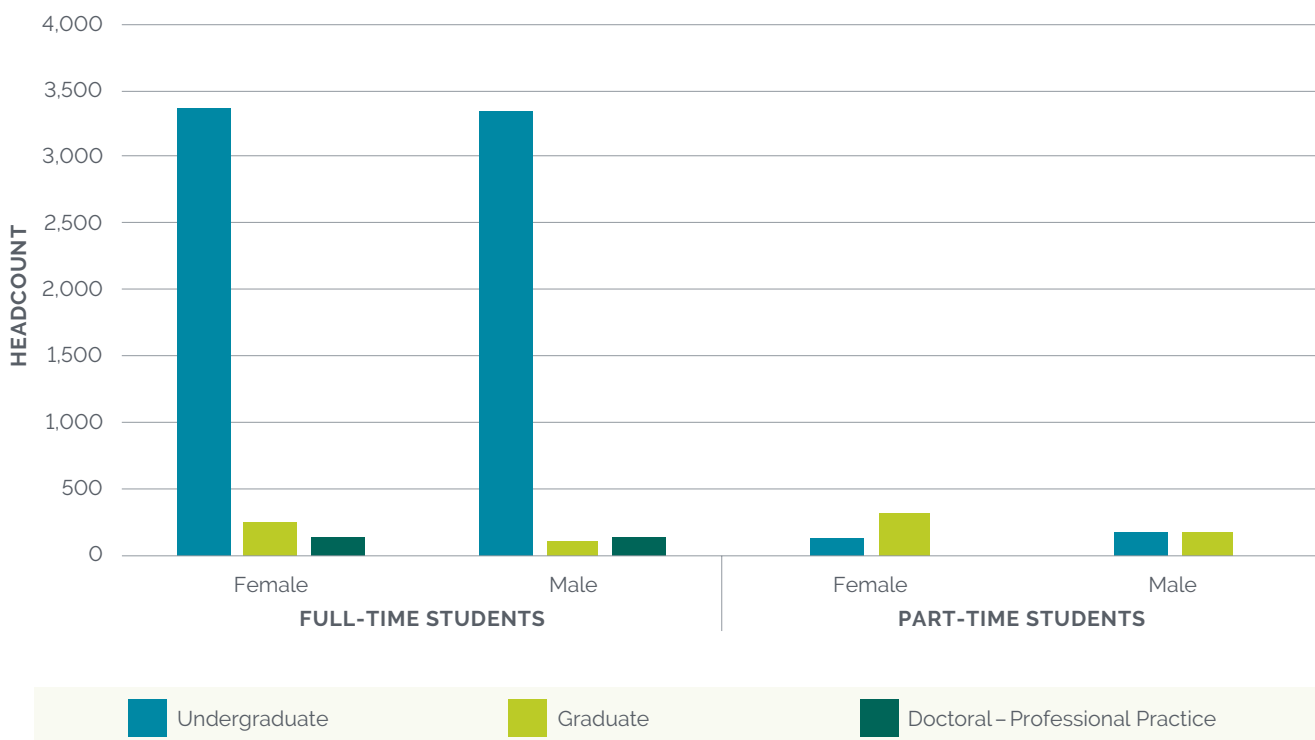

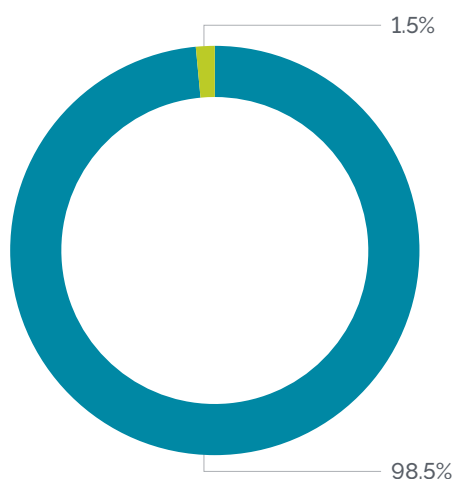

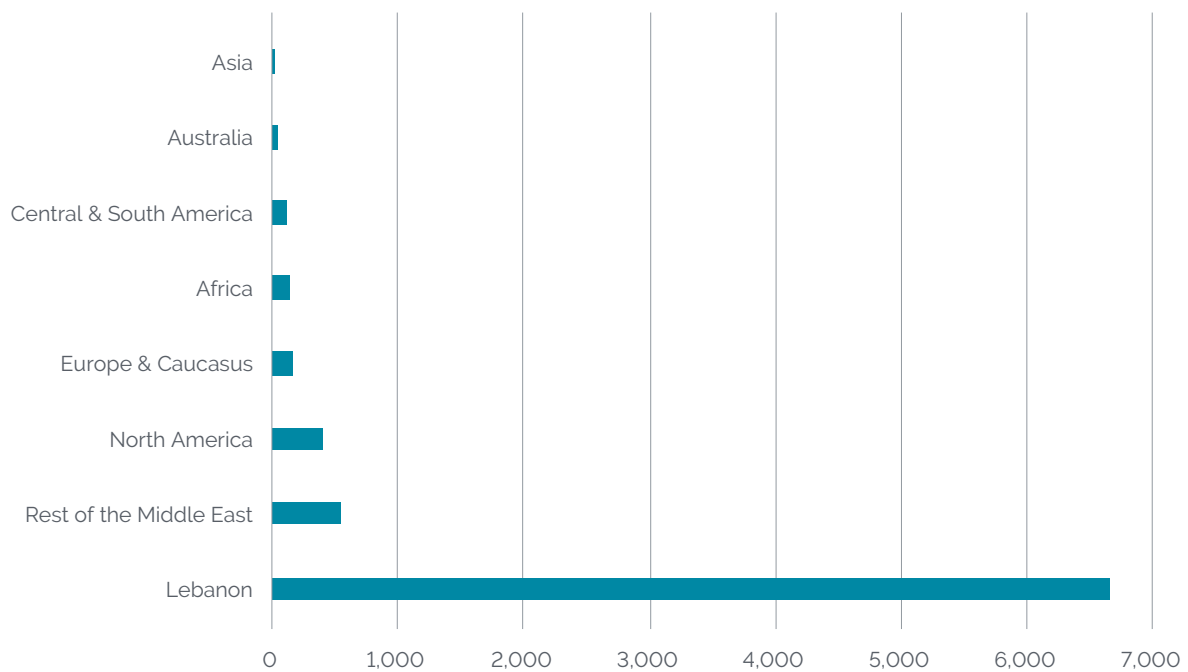

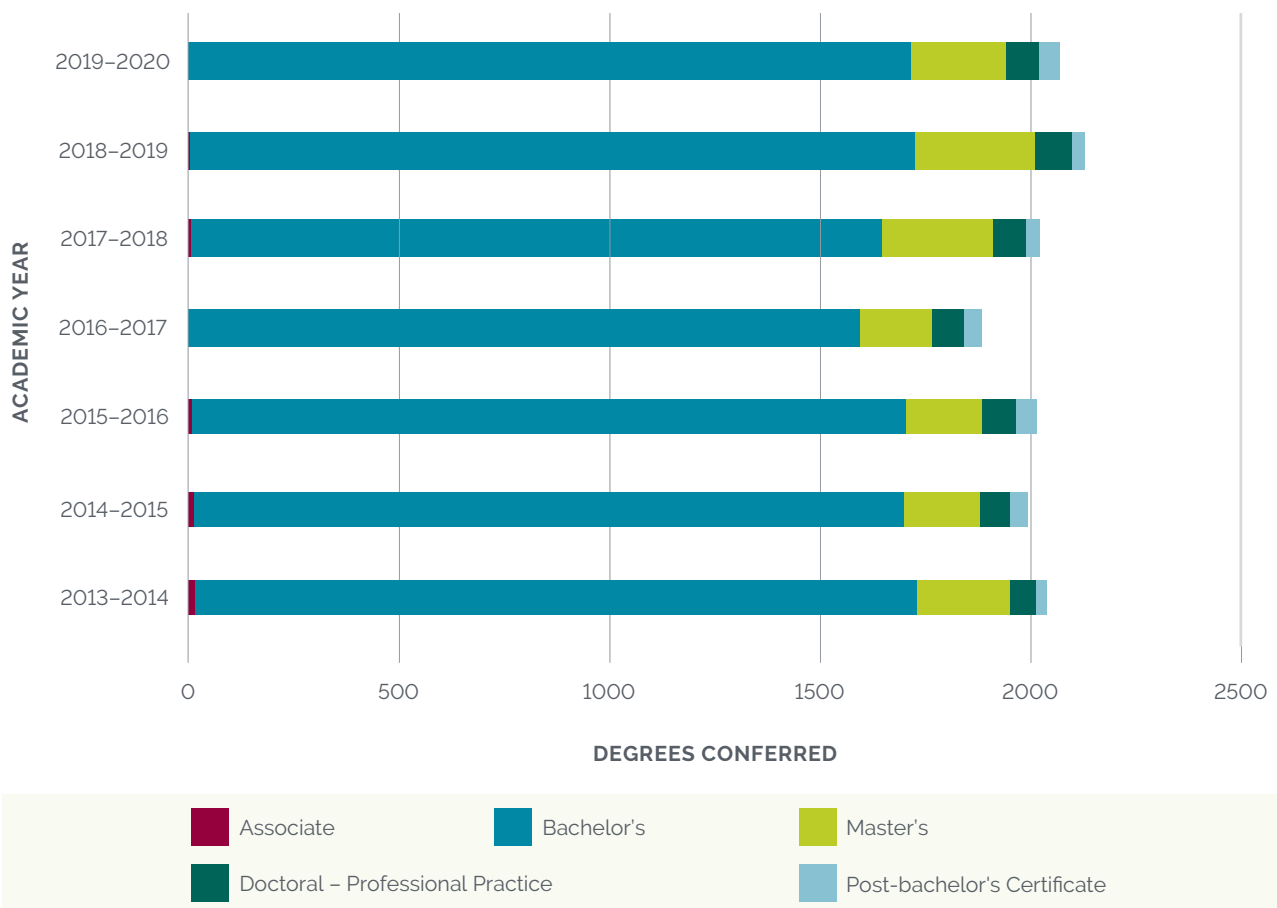

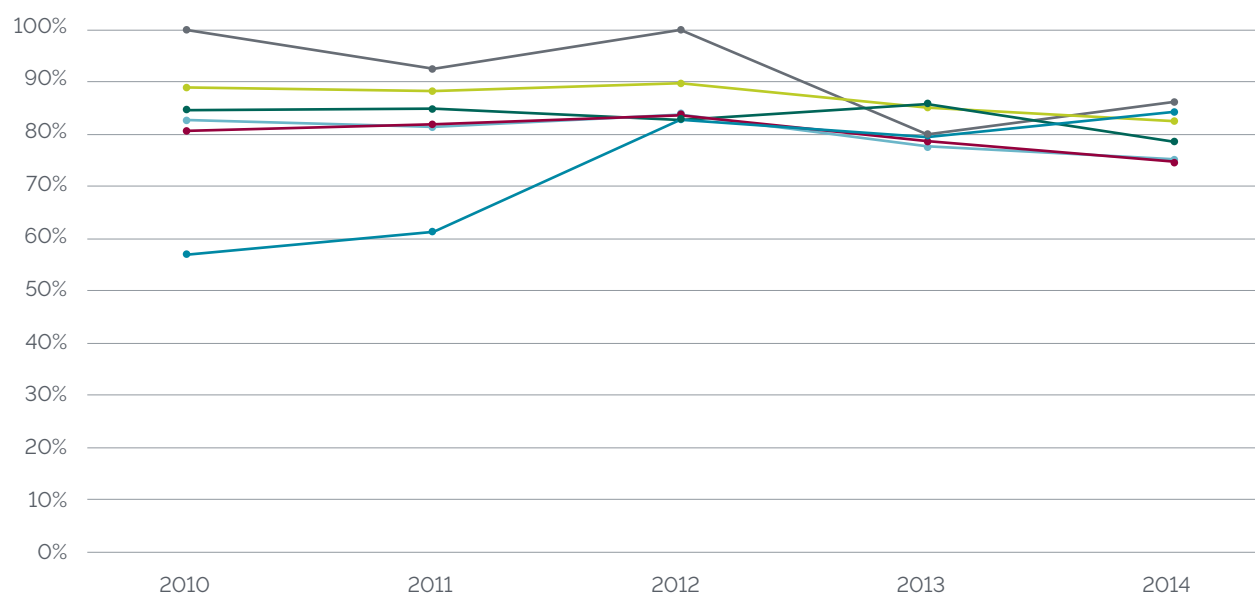

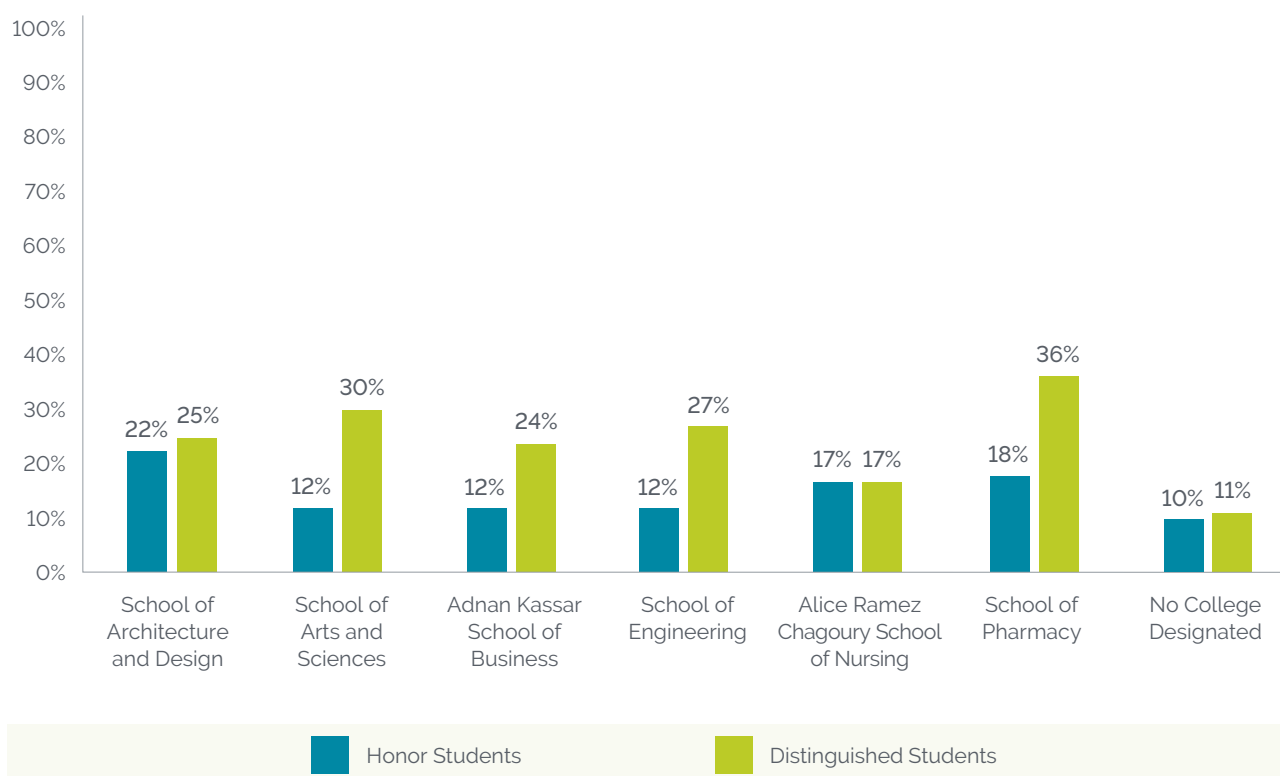

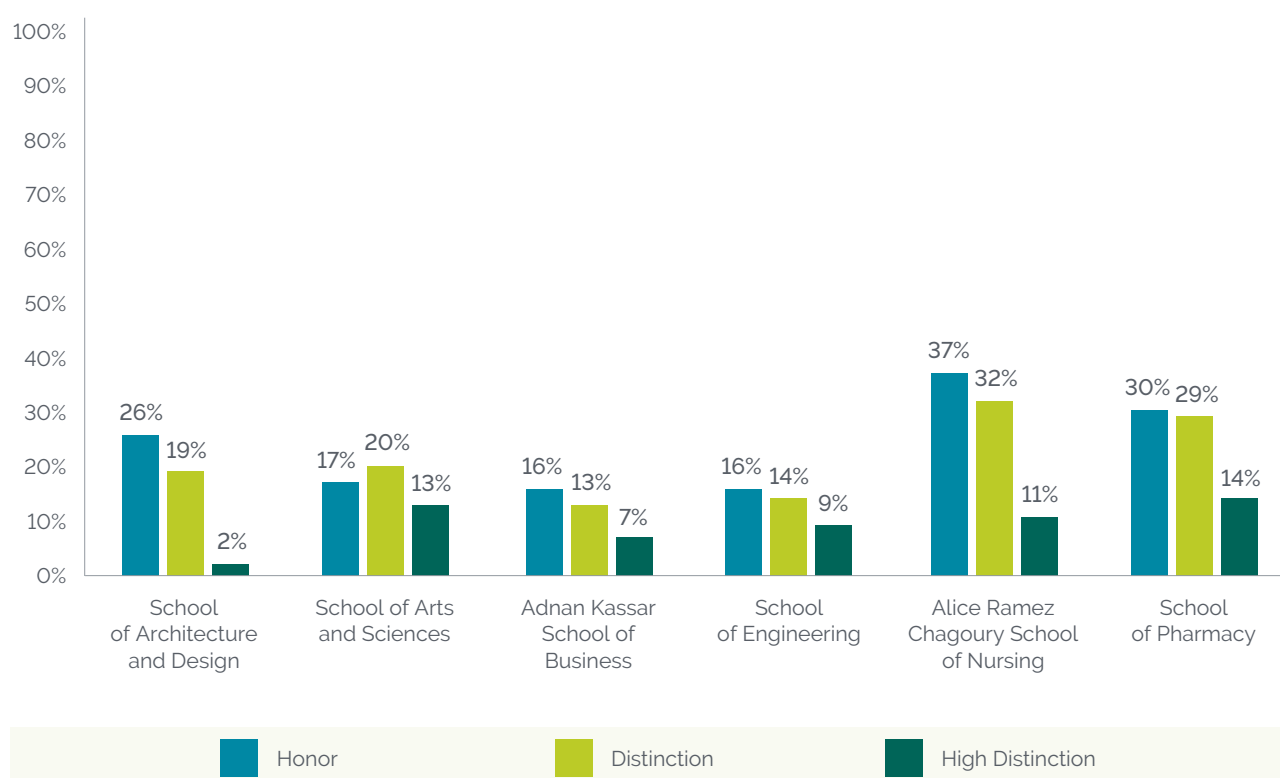

Honor, Distinction and High Distinction Graduating Students



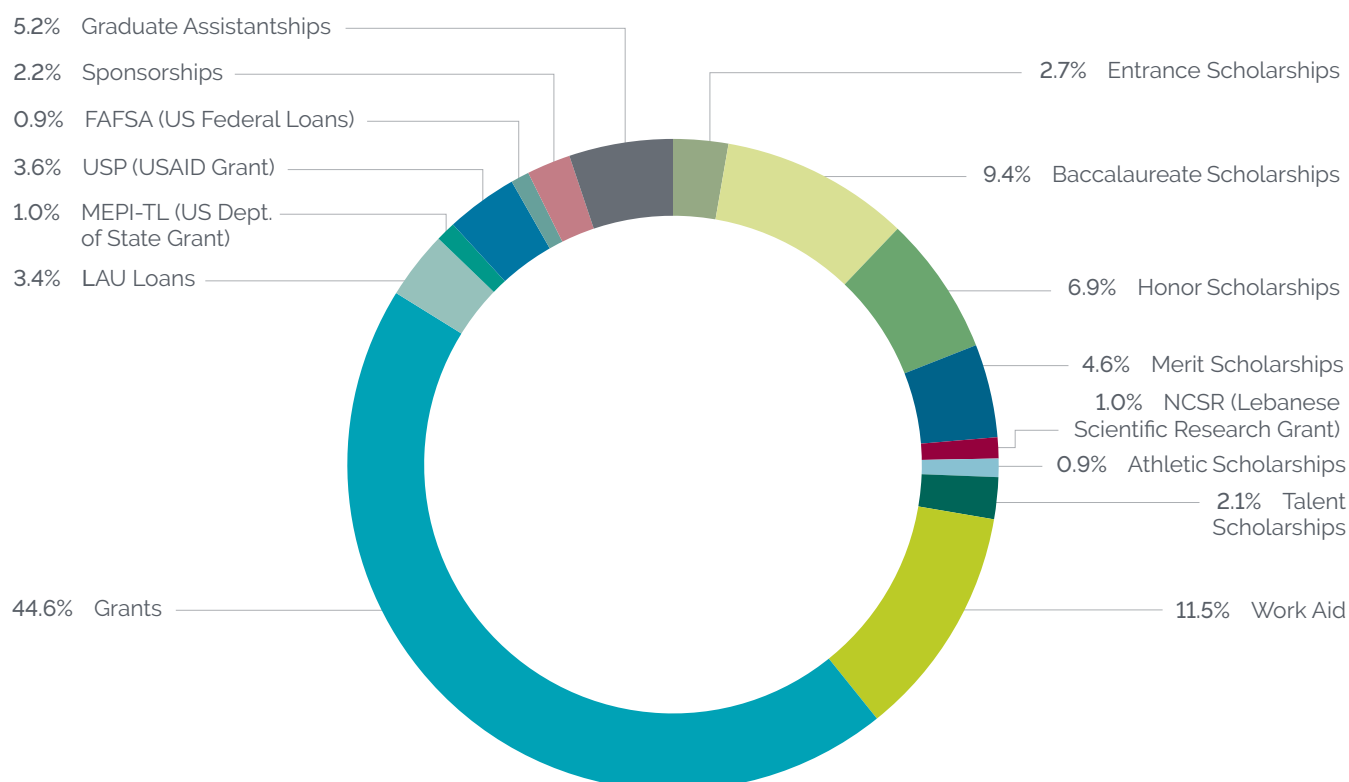

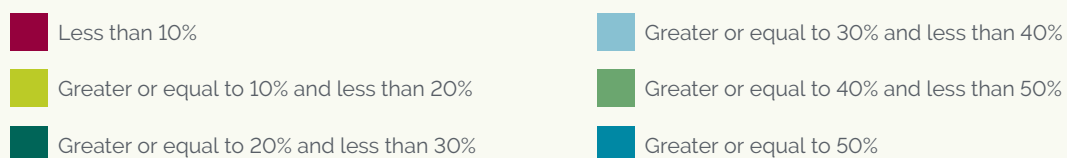
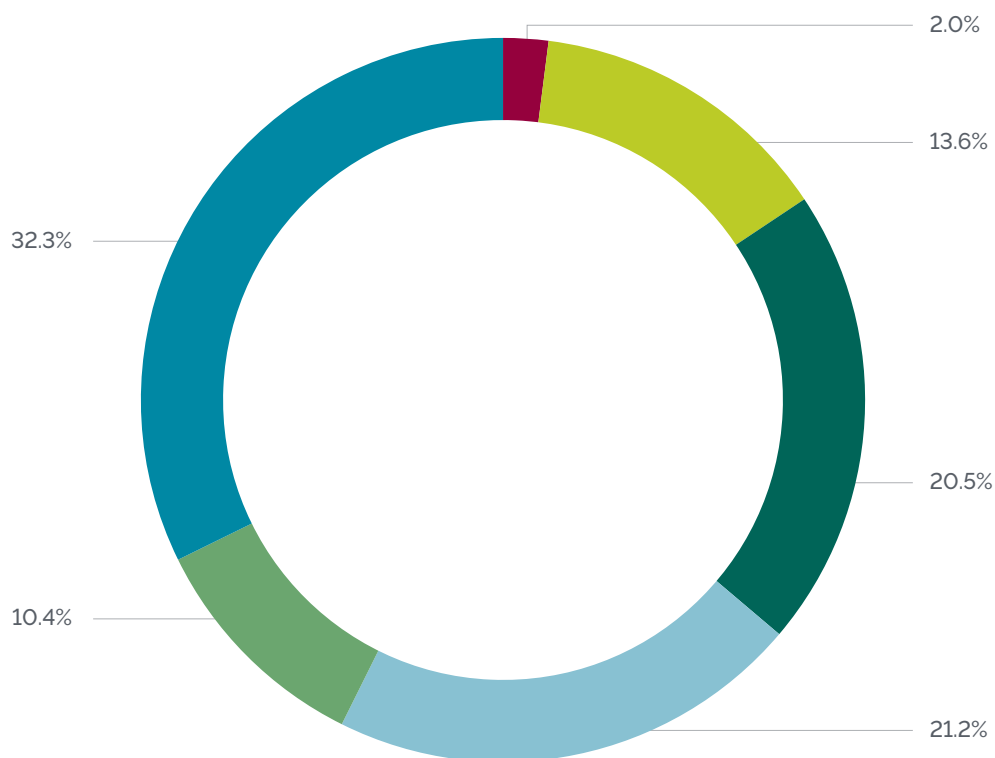

Distribution of Financial Aid Awards



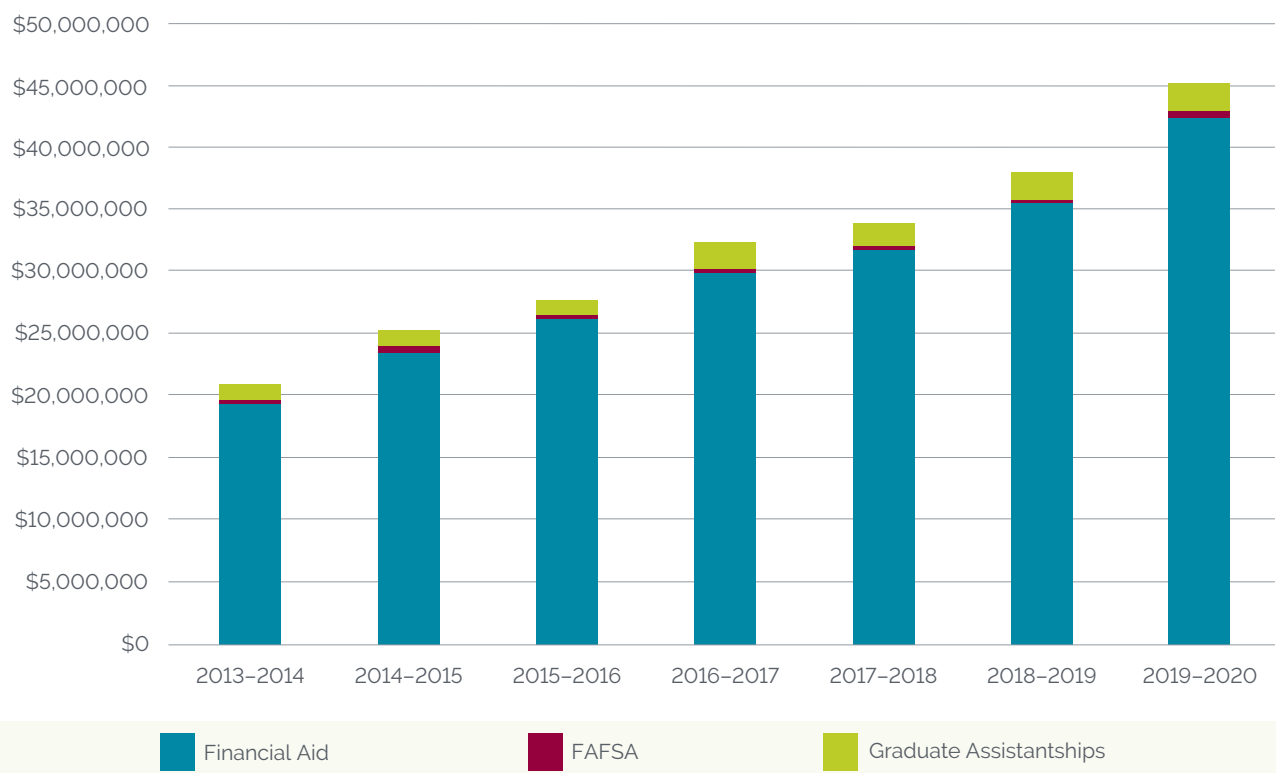

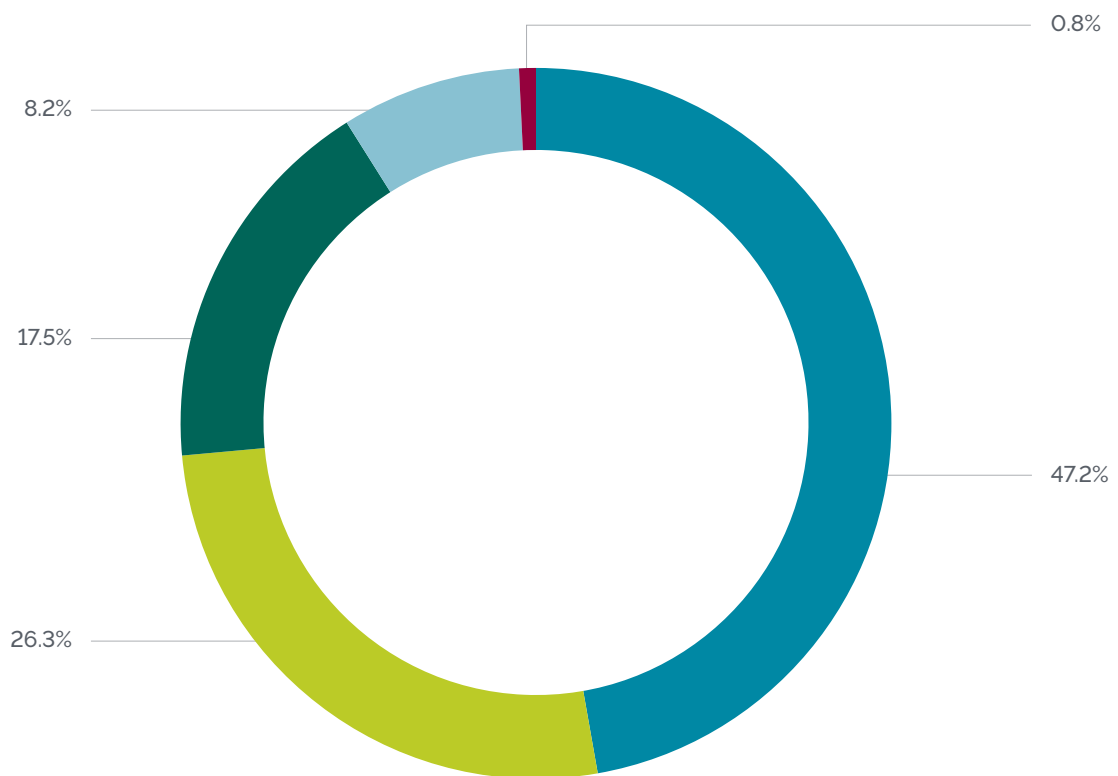

OCLC, since 2008 (a non-profit library service and research worldwide organization in which almost 25,900 libraries, archives and museums in 170 countries are members.); thanks to a Libraries Very Interested in Sharing (LVIS) agreement signed through OCLC, LAU libraries can now share resources with more than 4000 libraries around the world for free).

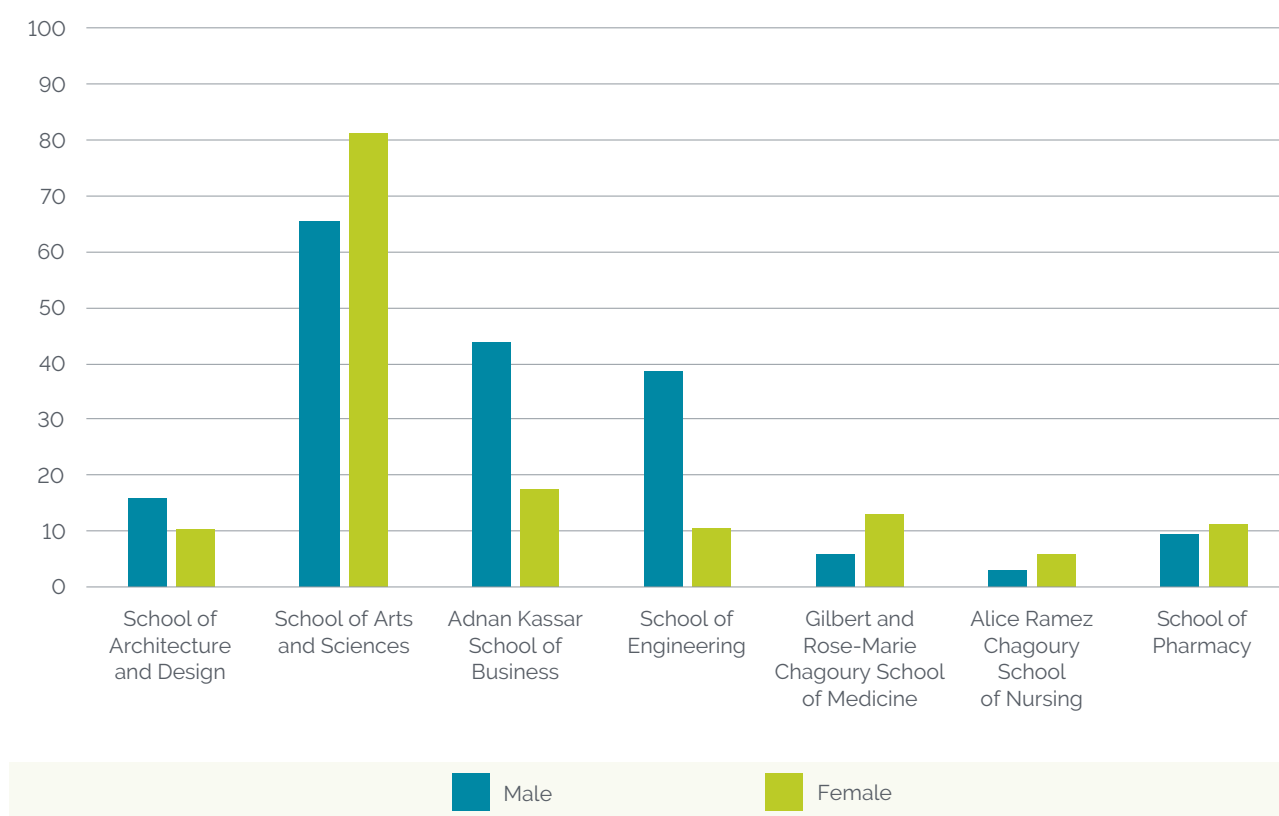

Full-time Faculty by Rank

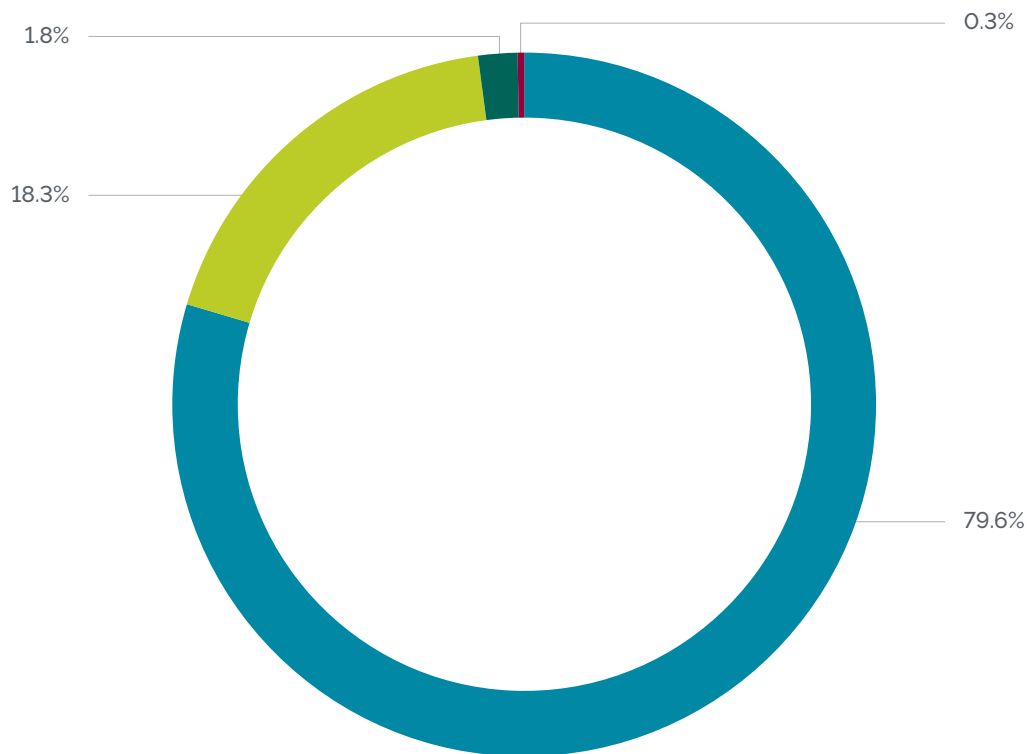

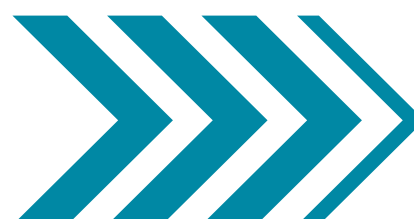

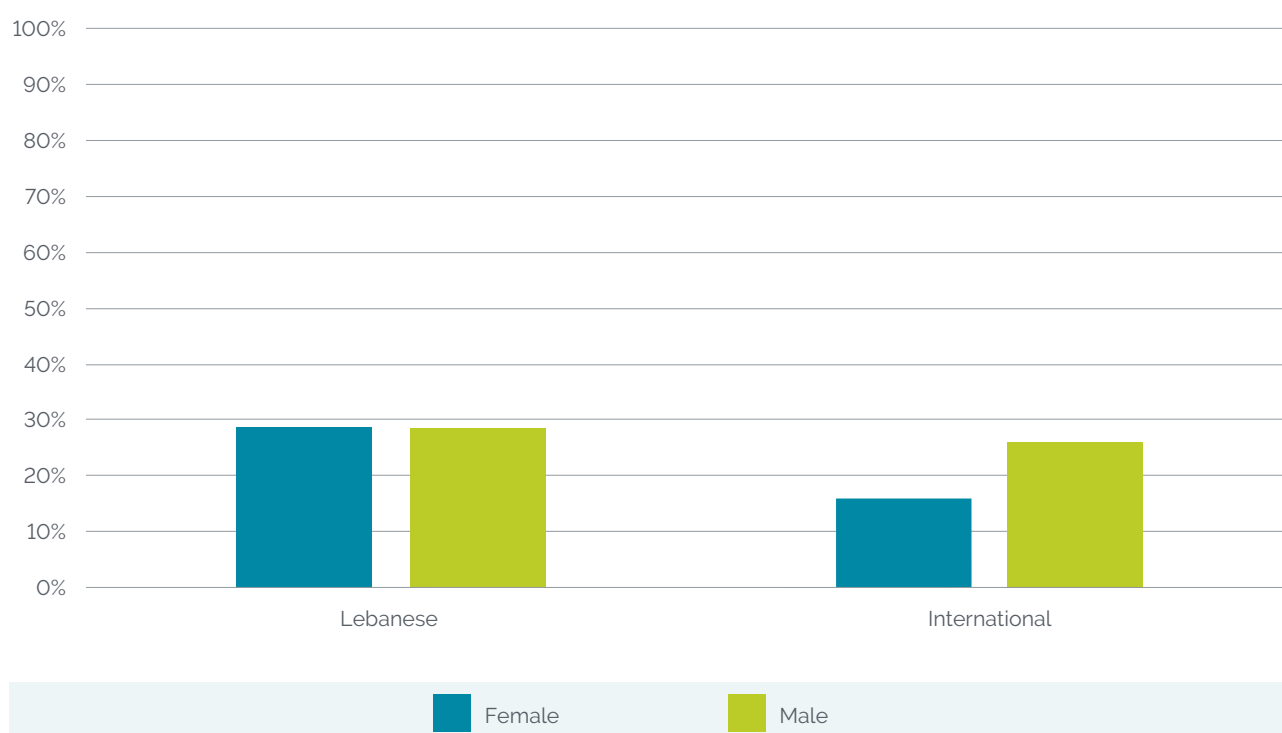

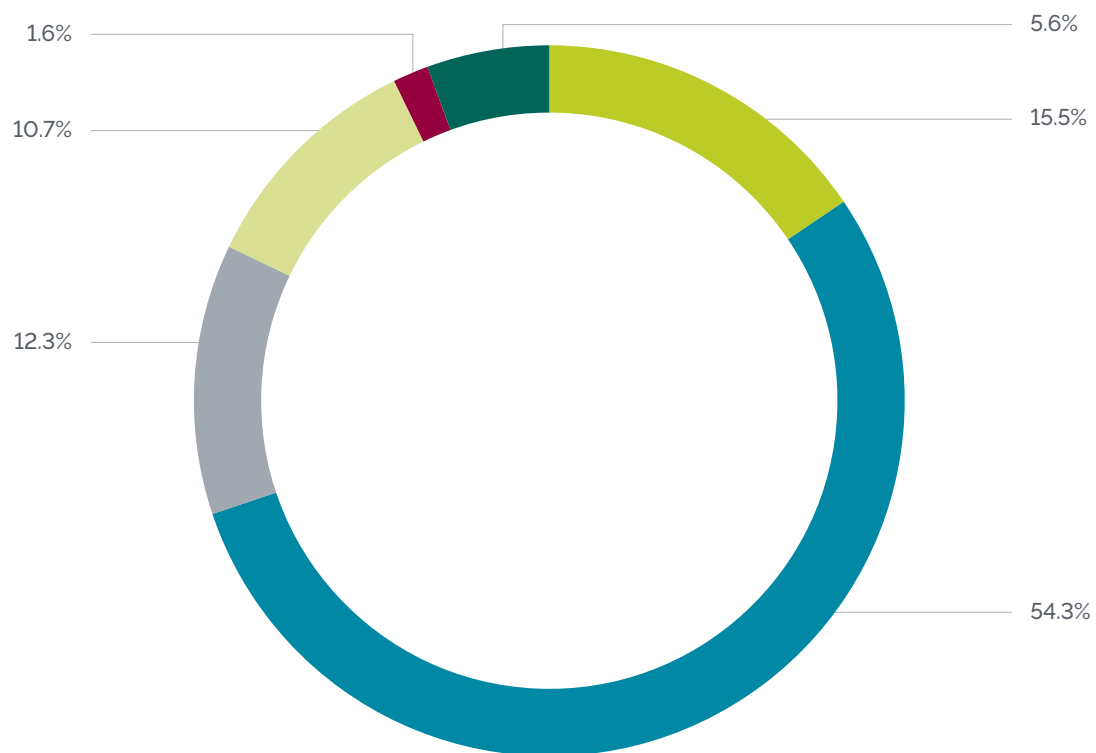

Part-time Faculty by School



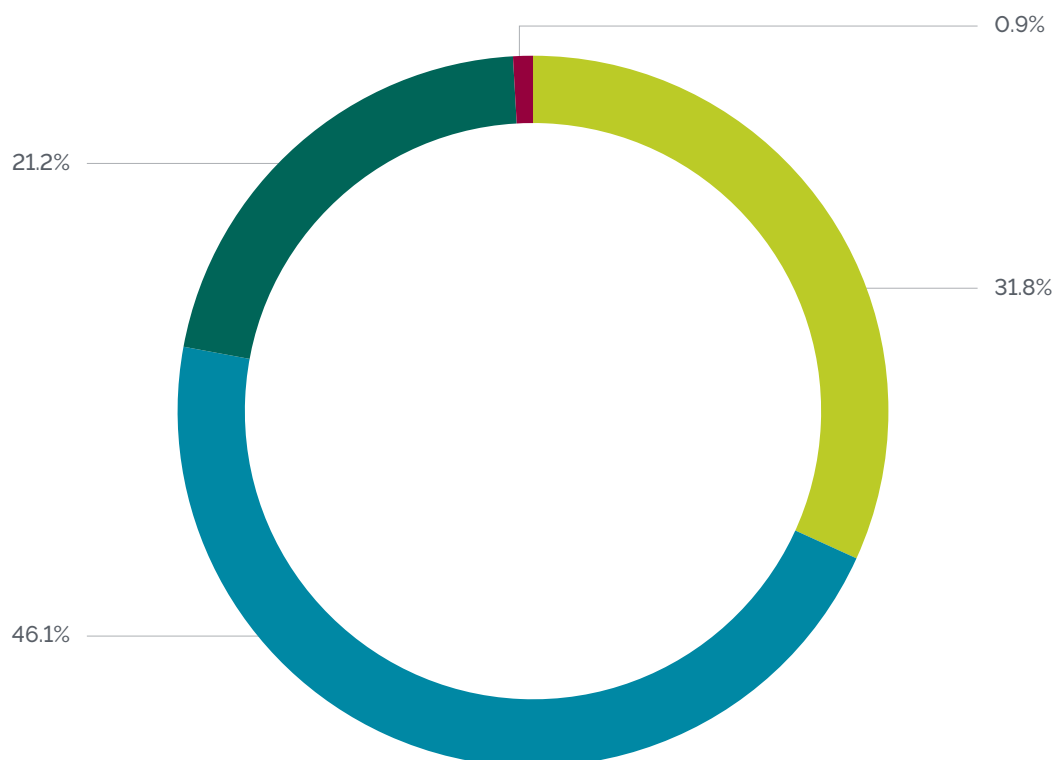

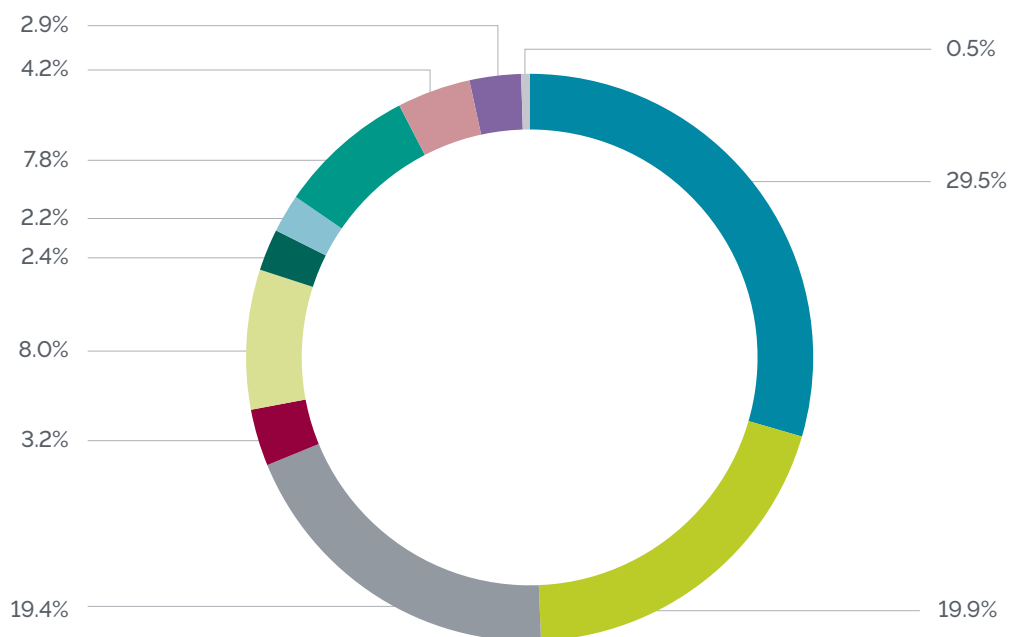

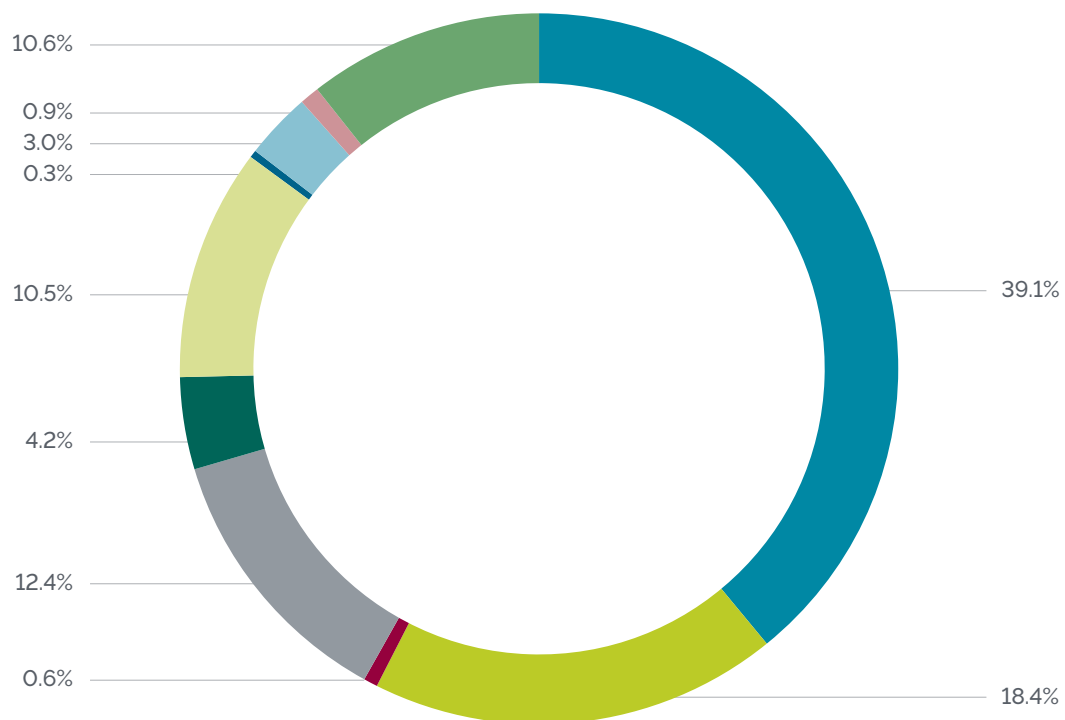
Expenses per Student AY 2019–2020

Expenses by Function 2019–2020

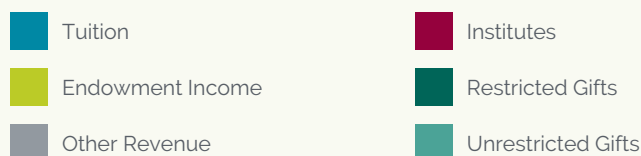
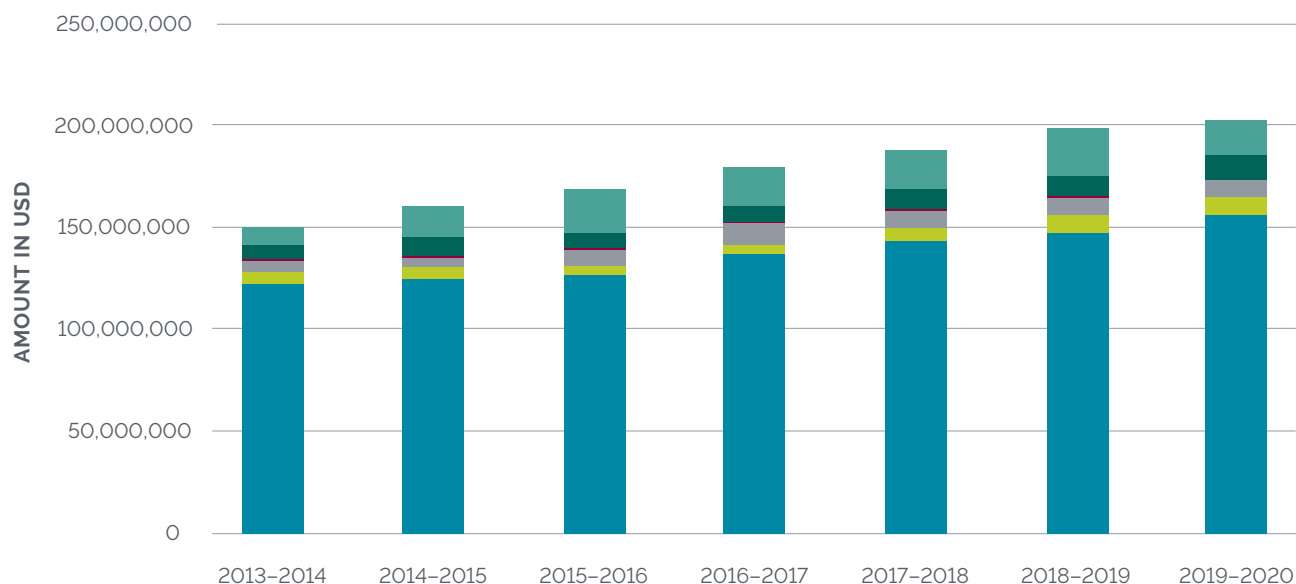

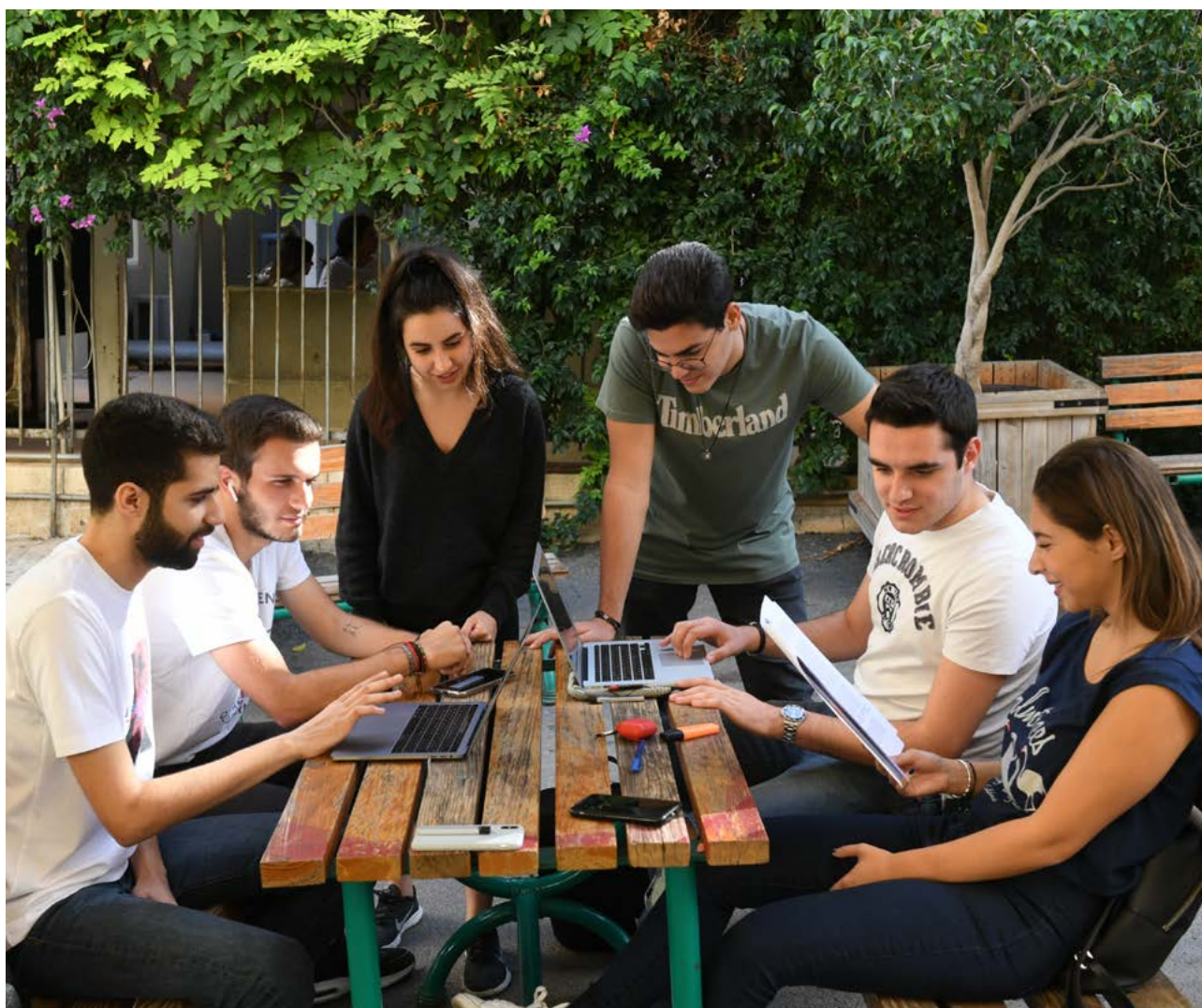


► Housing Spaces

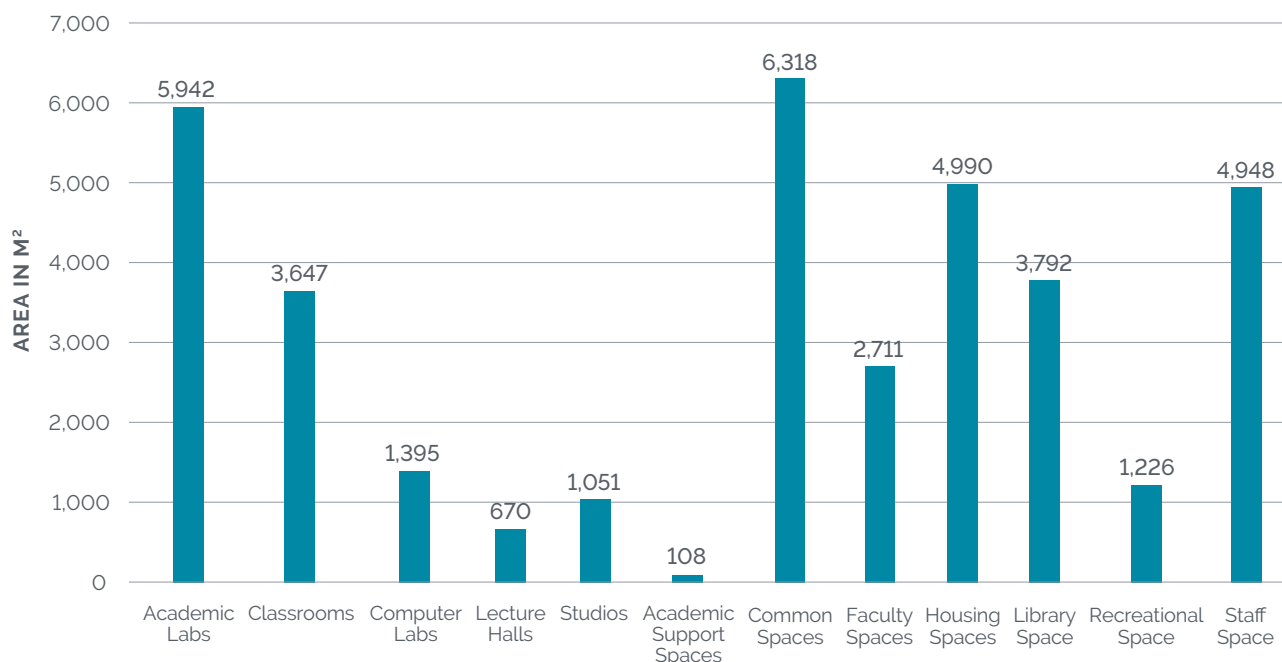

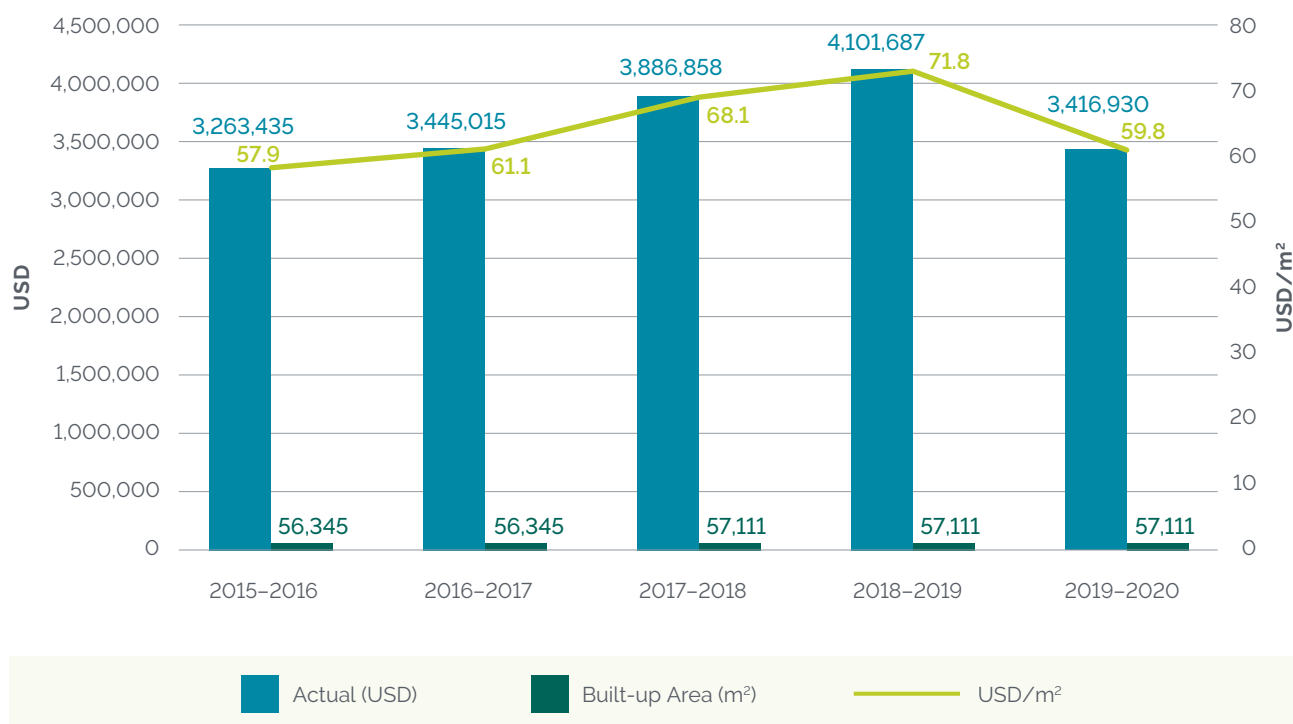

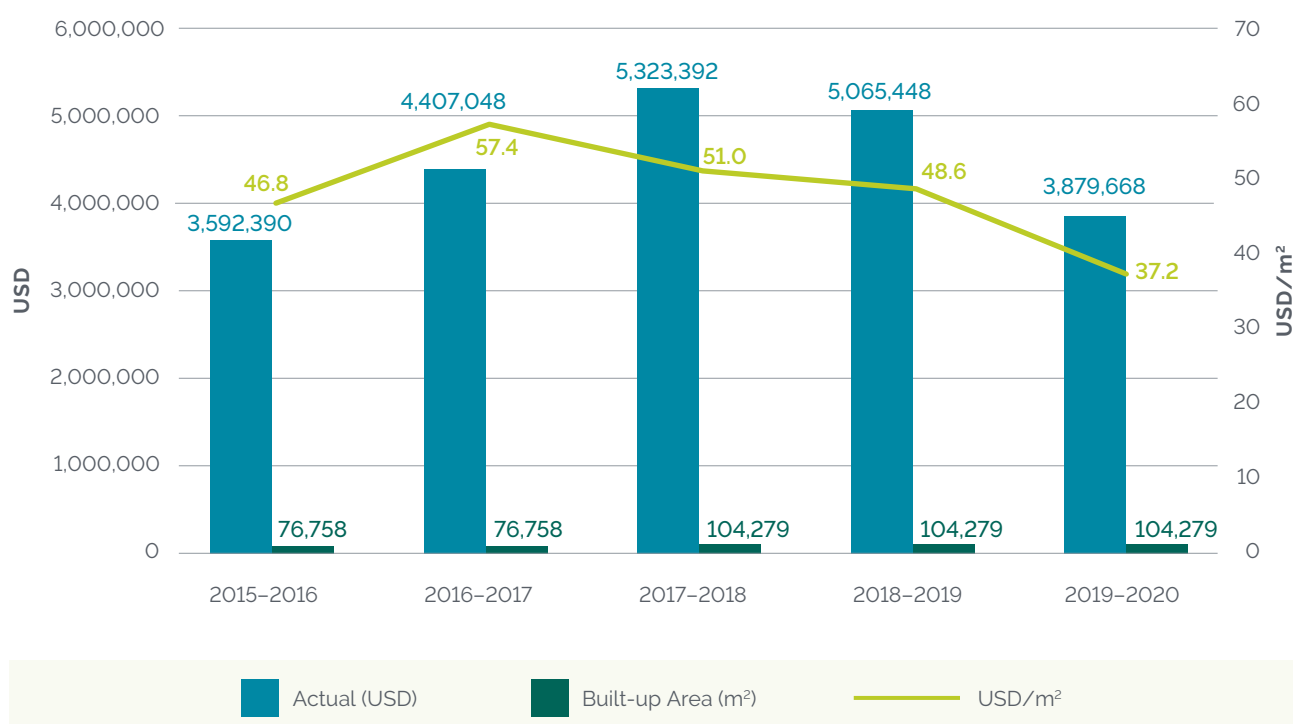


PHYSICAL PLANT EXPENDITURE VS BUILT-UP AREA (INCLUDING OPERATIONS & MAINTENANCE)

Physical Plant Byblos - Expenses vs Built-up Area 2016–2020

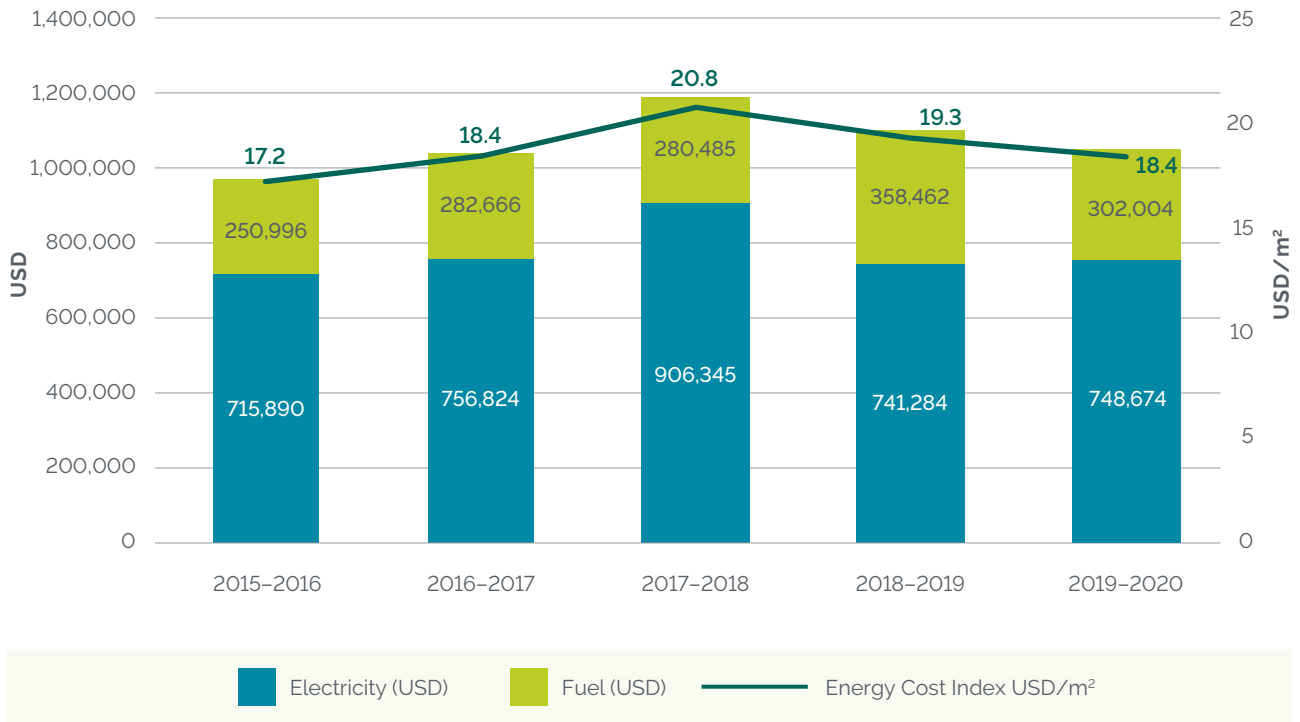

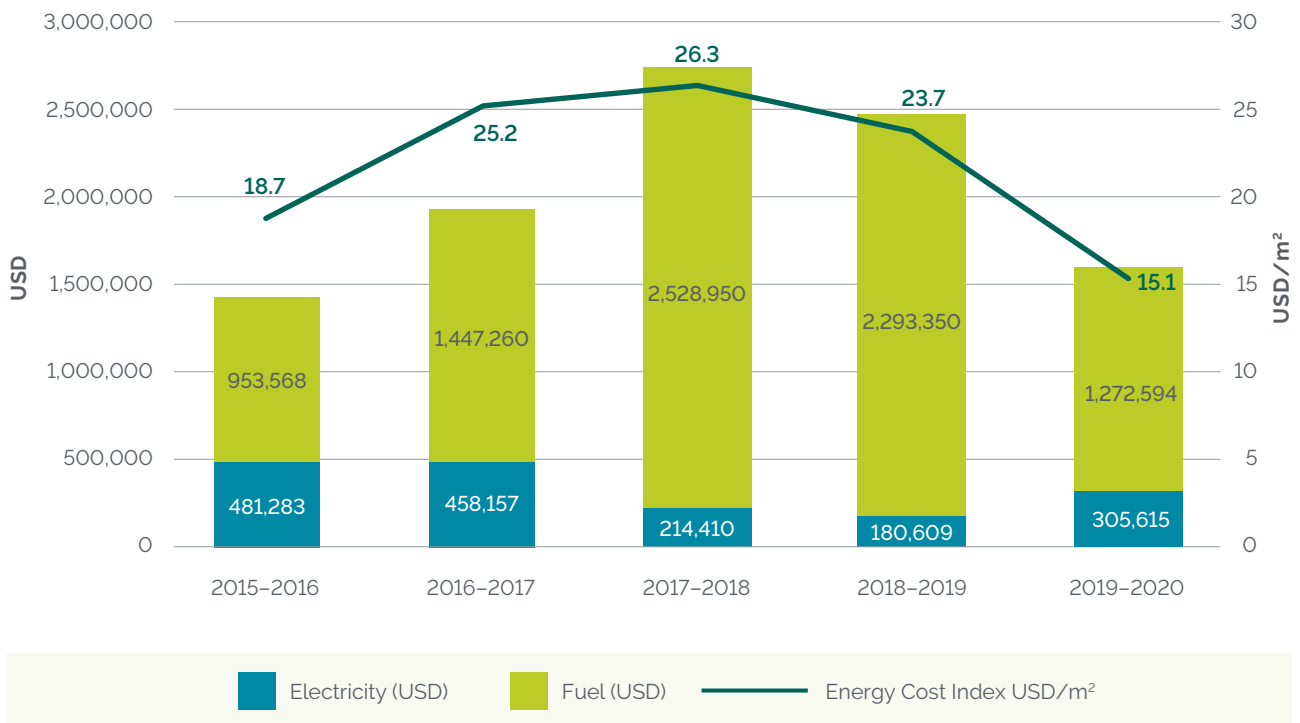

Physical Plant Byblos - Energy Cost 2016-2020

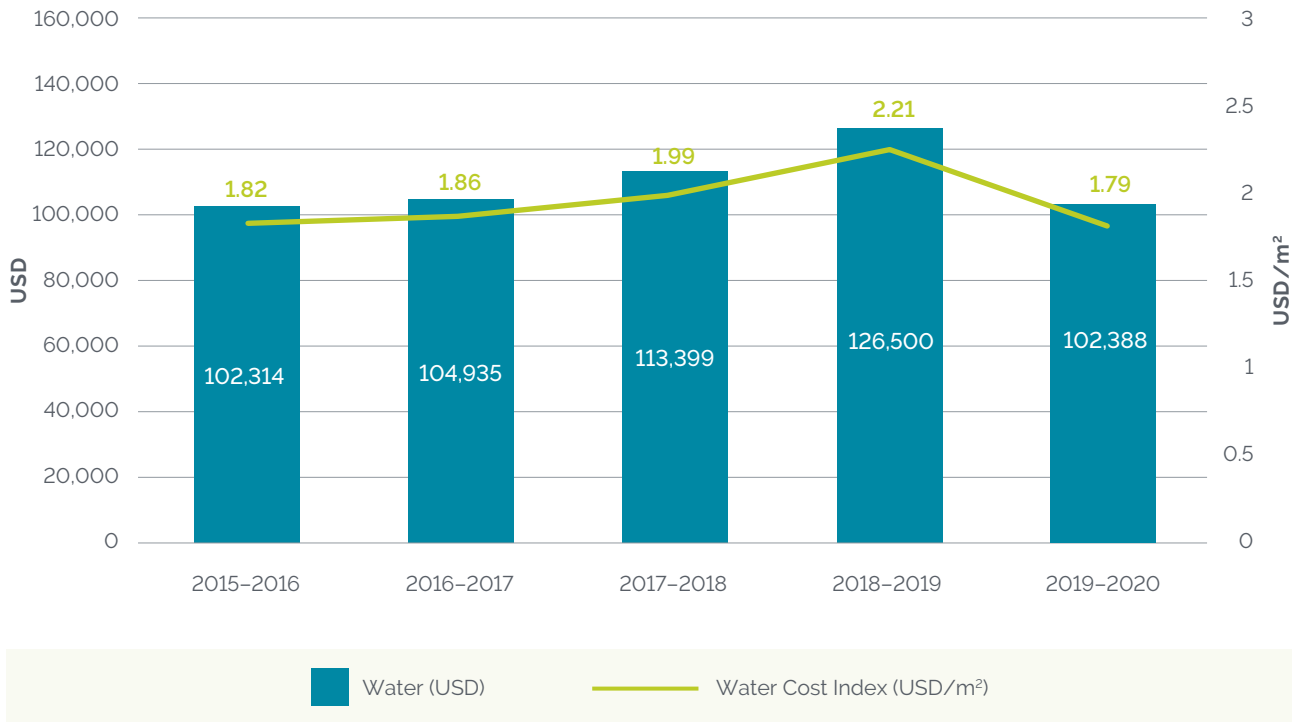

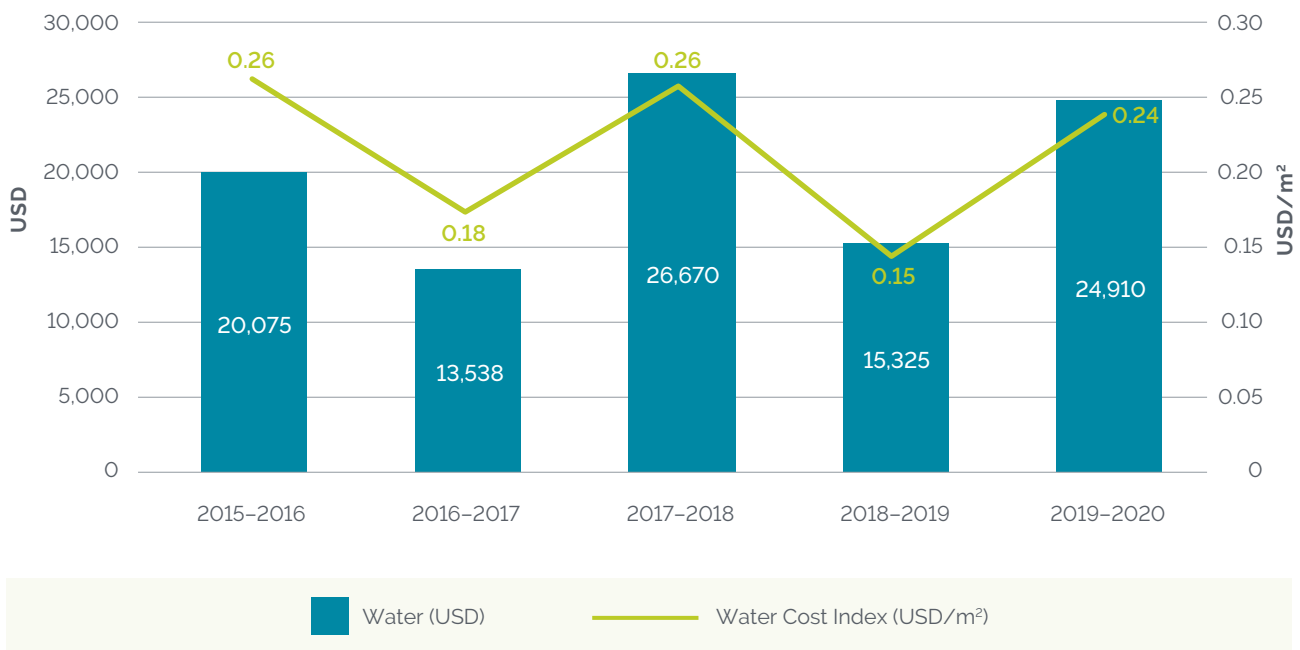

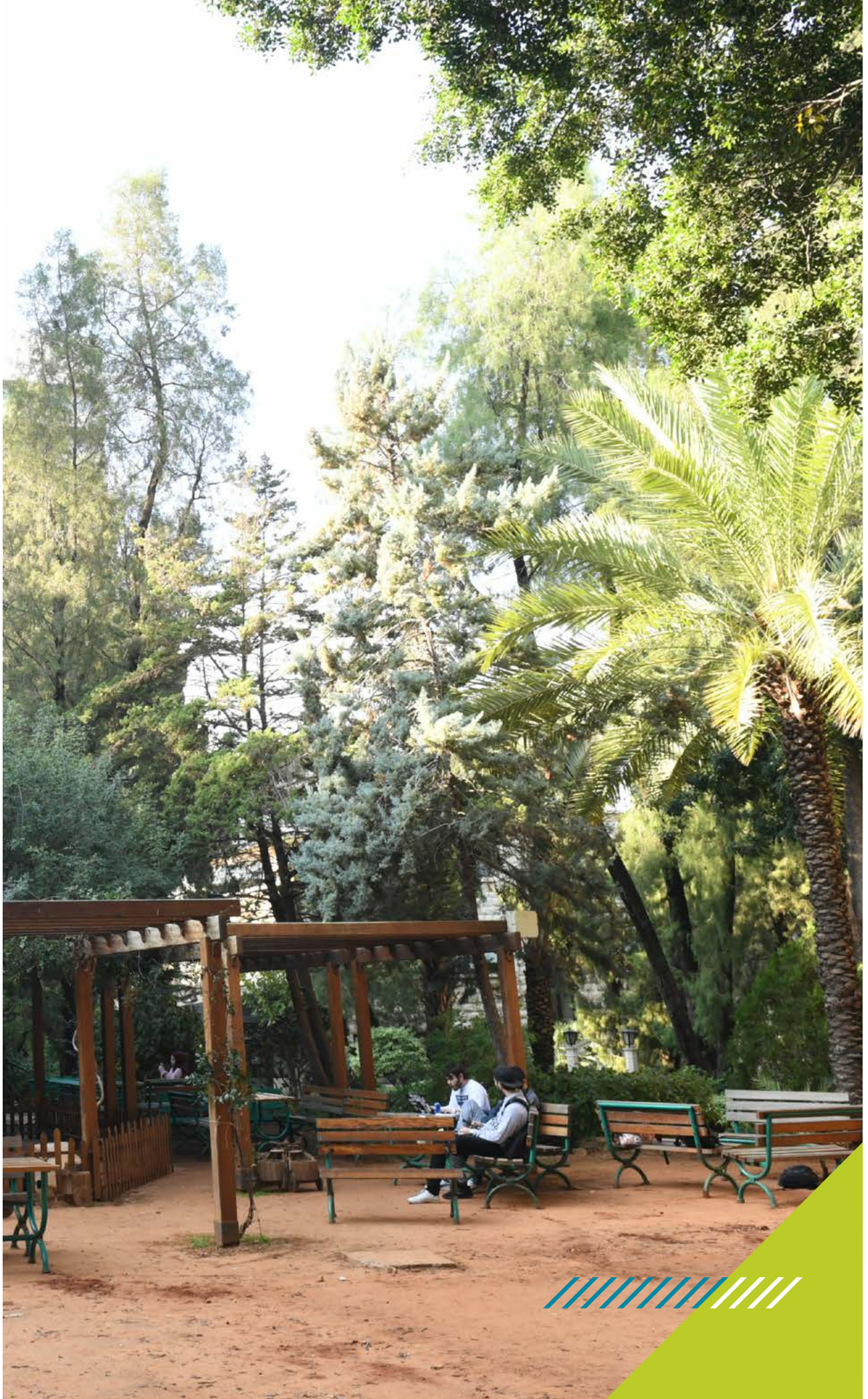
