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

ABOUT THE INSTITUTION

HISTORY AND LOCATION

The Lebanese American University (LAU) is a recognized not-for-profit university established in 1924, chartered by the Board of Regents chartered by the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York in the United States of America. The university is fully recognized by the Lebanese Ministry of Education and Higher Education, affirming its commitment to high standards of academic excellence both nationally and internationally.

LAU's origins trace back to 1835, with the establishment of the American School for Girls in Beirut by Presbyterian missionaries. The university was formally inaugurated as a junior college for women in 1924 and transitioned to a coeducational institution in the 1970s. During this period, LAU also founded the Arab Institute for Women, a leading center for women's studies in the region. This strong legacy of inclusivity and innovation has guided the university's growth and positioned it as a key player in Lebanon's and the region's educational landscape.

For nearly a century, LAU has played a vital role in addressing the educational needs of Lebanon and the broader Middle East. Its liberal arts education model provides students with a comprehensive foundation in critical thinking, interdisciplinary knowledge, and essential soft skills, which enhance their employability and success in an increasingly competitive global market.

LAU operates two campuses in Beirut and Byblos, Lebanon, with state-of-the-art infrastructure and comprehensive services, from libraries, labs, and athletic facilities, to residence halls, a branch campus in New York registered in 2024, and two teaching hospitals: the LAU Medical Center–Rizk Hospital in the heart of Beirut which boasts the only Comprehensive Stroke Center in Lebanon, and the LAU Medical Center–St John's Hospital in the Jounieh /Byblos area.

LAU offers a diverse range of more than 60 undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral programs across its seven schools: Architecture and Design, Arts and Sciences, Business, Engineering, Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy. Through these programs, LAU prepares students for successful careers and leadership roles, both regionally and internationally.

Today, LAU stands as a leading private university in Lebanon, guided by a strong commitment to ethical values and nonsectarian principles. With 21 centers and institutes dedicated to research and innovation, a distinguished faculty, and a robust network of partnerships, LAU continues to expand its influence across academic disciplines.

ACCREDITATION

LAU is accredited by the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE), formerly the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc.


ACADEMIC SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES

The University comprises seven schools: The School of Architecture and Design, the School of Arts and Sciences, the Adnan Kassar School of Business, the School of Engineering, the Gilbert and Rose-Marie Chagoury School of Medicine, the Alice Ramez Chagoury School of Nursing, and the School of Pharmacy.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS AND DEGREES CONFERRED

Academic offerings include 63 degree programs: 34 bachelor's degree programs, 19 master's degree programs, 4 online master's degree programs, 2 professional degree programs, 2 online graduate certificates and 2 post-bachelor's certificates.

During the Academic Year 2022-2023, the university awarded 1,665 bachelor's degrees, 345 master's degrees, 97 doctoral/professional practice degrees and 26 post-bachelor's certificates.



FACULTY

Full-time faculty for fall 2023 totaled 316, of whom 36 hold the rank of professor, 125 the rank of associate professor and 83 the rank of assistant professor. 80 percent of the full-time faculty hold a doctorate or other terminal degree. Full-time physicians for the academic year 2023-2024 totaled 107.

ENROLLMENT

With 7,499 undergraduates, 837 graduates and 274 students in doctoral/professional practice degree programs, enrollments in fall 2023 totaled 8,610. Of the 7,669 full-time students, 93 percent are undergraduates, 3 percent are graduate students and 4 percent of the students are enrolled in doctoral/professional practice degree programs. The undergraduate student body is 48 percent male. Of the total number of students enrolled, 1,047 are from 71 foreign countries.

ADMISSIONS /RETENTION


2,120 undergraduate students are enrolled for the fall 2023. 30 percent of all first-time applicants enrolled. 4,170 or 93 percent of accepted first-time students attended schools within Lebanon. 463 or 54 percent of graduate students were accepted and 64 percent enrolled in fall 2023. Of the students in doctoral – professional practice degree programs, 161 or 63 percent were accepted and 57 percent enrolled in the academic year 2023-2024.

FINANCE

LAU's operating budget for 2022-2023 was \$202,593,168, a 5 percent increase from the 2021-2022 budget, reflecting the university's careful expenditure policy on growth and expansion especially during the country's economic crisis and pandemic. 48 percent of this was earmarked for student financial aid.

PHYSICAL FACILITIES

LAU campuses occupy 345,143 square meters of space, of which the Beirut campus represents 27,500 square meters and the Byblos campus 317,643 square meters. The University is also a major shareholder in the LAU Medical Center-Rizk Hospital and the LAU Medical Center-Saint John's Hospital.

CHARTER AND ACCREDITATION

CHARTER

LAU is chartered by the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York. The University of the State of New York is the sole entity authorized by the State of New York to incorporate higher education institutions and authorize them to confer degrees.

Beirut College for Women (which was to become LAU) was granted a provisional charter by the Board of Regents in 1950, and an absolute charter five years later. Since then, the charter has been amended several times in response to the institution's growth.

The University of the State of New York is a large system of educational services, including thousands of schools, colleges, universities, museums, libraries and other institutions. Its Board of Regents sets overall education policy for the State of New York and chooses a Commissioner of Education, who serves as president of the University of the State of New York and heads the New York State Education Department.

ACCREDITATION

Degrees awarded by LAU are officially registered with the Ministry of Higher Education in Lebanon and with the Board of Education in the State of New York.

INSTITUTIONAL ACCREDITATION

LAU is accredited by the **New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE)**, formerly the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc.

SCHOOL OF ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN

Bachelor of Architecture

The Bachelor of Architecture degree is officially recognized by the Lebanese Ministry of Education and Higher Education, which entitles its holder to register in the Order of Engineers & Architects in Lebanon. In addition, the BArch program has been granted initial accreditation as of 2019 by the National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB), which accredits architecture programs in the United States. Following that, the program was revisited in March 2023, and was granted continuing accreditation for an 8-year term, effective as of January 2023. The program is the first in Lebanon and the third outside the United States to receive NAAB accreditation: <https://www.naab.org/>.

The Bachelor of Architecture degree is also officially recognized as equivalent to the Diplome d'Etat d'Architecte (DEA) by the Ministry of Culture in France.

b. Bachelor of Design Programs

The School of Architecture and Design at LAU earned the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD) Accreditation in 2020. The NASAD accreditation covers the BA in Fine Arts, the BFA in Interior Design, the BFA in Graphic Design, the BFA in Fashion Design and the Master in Islamic Art.

b. Bachelor of Science in Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (CP)

The BS in Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (CP) at the School of Arts and Sciences has been granted candidacy for accreditation by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND), the accrediting agency for the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics in the United States. As the first step in a four-year accrediting process, the candidacy by ACEND grants current and future students the same rights of a fully accredited program.

The Adnan Kassar School of Business (AKSOB) is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International. In addition, AKSOB's Hospitality and Tourism Program is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Programs in Hospitality Administration (ACPHA).

AKSOB's portfolio includes three undergraduate degree programs: BS in Business, BS in Economics, and BS in Business Emphasis Hospitality and Tourism Management; and four minor programs: Minor in Business, Minor in Data Analytics, Minor in Economics, and Minor in Hospitality and Tourism Management; in addition to eight graduate programs: Master of Business Administration (MBA), MBA in Business Analytics (online), Executive MBA, MBA in Global Business Administration (online), MA in Applied Economics, Master of Laws, MS in Human Resources Management and MBA in Healthcare Management (online).













ENROLLMENT BY PLACE OF ORIGIN






RETENTION RATES*: FIRST-TIME STUDENTS







BACHELOR'S DEGREES 150% GRADUATION RATES











- ▲ The Lebanese Interlibrary Loan/Document Delivery Services consortium (LIDS), since 2007 (established by LAU in cooperation with Kaslik University, Notre Dame University and University of Balamand and recently joined by the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia-Commission of Lebanon (ESCWA), Haigazian University, Middle East University, Beirut Arab University, American University of Beirut and Banque Du Liban or Lebanese Central Bank);
- ▲ OCLC, since 2008 (a non-profit library service and research worldwide organization in which almost 25,900 libraries, archives and museums in 170 countries are members). Thanks to a Libraries Very Interested in Sharing (LVIS) agreement signed through OCLC, LAU libraries can now share resources with more than 4,000 libraries around the world for free).





FULL-TIME FACULTY BY RANK





FULL-TIME FACULTY BY NATIONALITY









HOUSING SPACES


